The following paragraph was published
by the Simcoe Correspondent in the
Simcoe Record, dated Jan. 10, 1947:
There has been a great deal of talk
of the plan to open a department store
at the corner of Main and Talbot Sts.
The plan is to open a department store
and take over practically all the business
interests of the town. H. A. Sanderson
has been approached with a proposition to
sell out to the U. F. O. and become man-
ager of their concern. They will carry on
a grocery, dry goods, hardware, boot and
shoe, and sundry other departments, in-
cluding a butcher shop.

They will deal in all food, live stock
and grain. At least this is their ambi-
tion. And the mass of their October sup-
porters have awakened to the situation.
There is unrest in Waterloo, and it is
such a type as to show any proposition
to hand over the title of North Norfolk
to a U. F. O. premier or cabinet minis-
ter. As far as can be learned, the North
Norfolk are not open even from the dispo-
sition of the member of the U. F. O.

We cannot conceive of where the Ex-

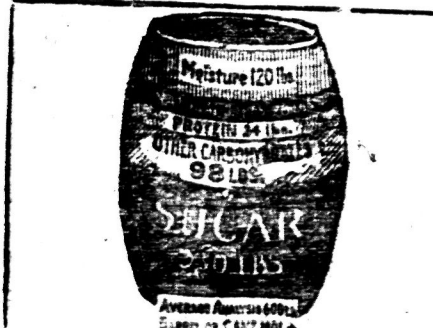
