Last Thursday afternoon, Frank Sutton and Geo. Stickle, two Waterford youth who were found guilty of stealing two motor tires, came before Magistrate Gunton for sentence. Sutton received 30 days dating from Jan. 23rd. Stickle was allowed out on probation. Both the Crown and the Magistrate referred to the good character Stickle had hitherto borne, and upon furnishing \$200 bail himself, and with Ira Stickle and William Albert Stickle becoming his sureties in like amounts, he was freed. —SIMCOE REFORMER.

### Triple Drowning at Port Dover

A triple drowning accident occurred at Port Dover about 5 o'clock Monday evening. Three boys, John Miller and two brothers named Weft, who were skating on Lake Erie, opposite Post Dover bathing house, broke through the ice and were beyond the powers of resuscitation when removed from the water, though the alarm was given by a fourth boy when his companions disappeared.

The two Weft brothers were aged six and eight years, and John Miller, six years old.

Their homes were in Port Dover. The older of the Weft boys lost his life in trying to rescue his younger brother, who went through the ice first.
