Exports From Forests. Reports of the Trade and Commerce Department show that, for the year ending November, 1918, Canadian exports of primary forest products totalled \$64,281,861. This is an increase of 22 per cent. over the pravious year. The exports from the forest were very nearly double those from the fisheries, and were 85 per cent. of those from the mine. In addition to the primary forest products, consisting mainly of lumber and unmanufactured wood in various forms, wood pulp was exported amounting to \$32,580.619. which wood in manufactured form. not otherwise covered, totalled \$826.-\$51. These figures are an indication of the economic importance of Cana-·la's forests, in the development of her

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LONG-LIVED INSECT.

The Cicada, or Tree Cricket, Has an Interesting History.

The longest-lived of American insects and the most persistent of our music makers, is the "tree cricket," usually incorrectly called "the locust." The Latin name is "cicada," meaning 'tree cricket," and the insect has an interesting history.

It is the longest-lived of our insects for the reason that it requires seventeen years to attain its growth. if they appeared every year or two in the same locality in great numbers, as do our locusts, also mis-named grasshoppers, fruit and forest trees would suffer from their attacks.

There are several distinct bloods of these tree crickets in different parts of the United States, and these appear at different times. Three of these colonies in the Southern States are credited my naturalists with having periods of thirteen years in which to come to maturity instead of the full period of seventeen years.

The cicada has a broad head with short antennae. But look at its eyes. Not only has it a large convex eye on each side of the head, but it has three simple eyes on the crown. It has three joints in the feet and wings, with wing coverts in both sexes. The body is black, banded with red on the abdo-The veins of the wings are men. red and orange. The eyes are red. The males are the musicians. That

loud, shrill, piercing sound which carries to a great distance, is made by a kind of bass fiddle, an apparatus at the lower part of the abdomen across which they drag their wings, and there it is, the fiddle and the bow.

The cicada or tree cricket has short legs and is devoid of the power to

leap like the grasshoper or the locust. It lives only a few weeks after arriving at perfection. It then performs the work of reproduction and dies. The eggs are laid by the female in slits cut in the bark of live twigs and by feeding on the twigs and leaves that injury is caused to

The young which are hatched about six weeks, do not feed on the leaves, but drop to the ground. There they bore down to the root juices. When about to become adult, the insect crawls out of the ground, molts for the last time and flies to the tree

The American tree cricket announces his arrival in July. It is a current saying when the cicadean fiddier gives his overture that it is "just six weeks until frost." Fortunately the prediction usually fails.

Immense Indian Food Dishes.

The largest food dishes in the world were recently bought of the Indians of Vanncouver Island, British Columbia, for the museum of the American Indian, New York City. These dishes were purchased from a tribe named Kwakiutis, which in English means "Smoke of the World." They are used for special festivals when great numbers of Indians gather to celebrate some religious or ritual festival. The dishes are carved out of wood and soups are brought to a boiling point by dropping hot stones into the food. The carvings represent the clan to which the dish belons, which in one instance is the "Wolf" and in another the "Eagle" clan.

Nictor Emmanuel Orlando is regarded as the strongest exponent of aiberalism in Italy by many of his countrymen, said one of them. He is a man of the people and has arrived at his position of eminence through sheer force of engracter and ability. Whatever may happen through political change or circumstance, Mr. Orlando will remain a force in the public life of Italy, because he is fearless, and progressive and has the confidence of the people.

Leonardo Vettetti, who was a pupil of Professor Orlando in the University of Rome, and who has the enthusiasm and reverence of all who have stood in his relation to the Premier of Italy has been in the United States on a mission from his government. "To understand Mr. Orlando you must know something of his life, the way in which he has come to the position he now occupies," Mr. Vettetti said to a representative of The Christian Science Monitor. "He is a Sicilian by birth, and was born in 1860 when Garibaldi was entering Palermo, so they gave him the name of Victor Emmannel. He was a good student, and, although of a peasant family, he acquired a fine education, making a specialty of Italian law, especially the

"When the war broke out, he was Secretary of Justice in the Cabinet of Salandra, and he was one of the first to express himself as being in favor of Italy entering the war on the side of the Allies. Italy was in the position of not being obliged to fight. but Mr. Orlando was the leader of the great Liberal body who clearly and promptly saw wherein lay the duty of Italy. With the downfall of Salandra, Mr .Orlando was appointed Secretary of the Interior, and was soon facing the diffeiult days following Italian defeat. It was recognized that
