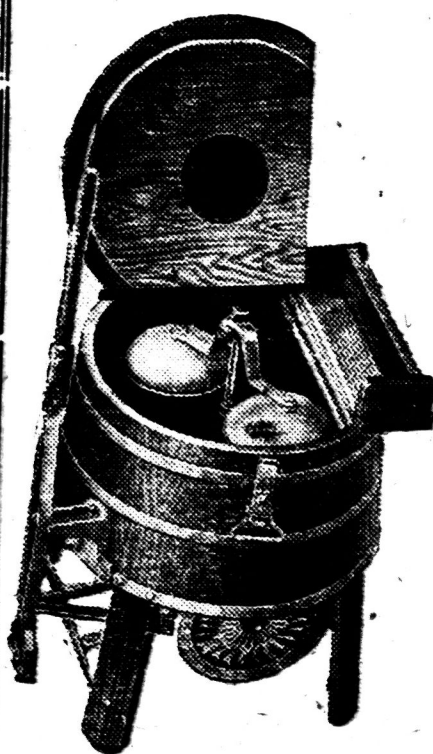

Stewart-Smithers—That the report of the Finance Committee be adopted as read, carried.	

Hudspeth Pyle—That leave be given to introduce a by-law fixing the County Treasurer's salary at \$1,200 a year and that the by-law be read a first time, carried.

Buncey-Smelter—That the by-law fixing the County Treasurer's salary be read a second and third time, signed, sealed and entitled a by-law as in the original motion carried.

Bradford McCarter—That the report of the Good Roads Committee be received and read, carried.

Cayuga, June 5, 1919.
To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—We, your Good Roads Committee, beg leave to report as follows:
1 The accounts presented by the Superintendent have been examined carefully and would recommend them for payment.
2 Permission given the trustees of the school section near Dennis' quarry to take strippings to grade and fill around the school house.

3 That we make an advance to McConnell and Hicklin on the contract of \$2,000.

4 Would recommend that the County make an arrangement with the village of Cayuga similar to that of the village of Caledonia, enabling them to receive the Government subsidy on a macadamized road built on Talbot and Munson streets, thereby connecting up the County Highway System passing through the village.

5 That the County Council meet on the second Thursday of each month during construction.

6 That the Warden, Chairman and Messrs. Smelser and Clark be a committee to advise the Superintendent what bridges and culverts are necessary to build with power to act.

7 That the Clerk be authorized to return the deposit cheque to Messrs. McConnell & Hicklin, which was received with their tender.

8 Would recommend that the following be the wage schedule for 1919:

Man, team, less waggon, per hour, 55 cents.

Man and team, with wagon, per hour, 60 cents.

All teamsters who stay during the whole season to receive an extra 5 cents per hour as a bonus.

9 Would recommend that George Bent tie be paid the sum of \$25 for damages to automobile on Division 24.

10 That no action be taken on account for damages for Leslie Moore.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Pyle Hudspeth—That the report of the Good Roads committee be adopted as read, carried.

Clark-Tooley—That a by-law be introduced and read a first time for fixing the schedule of appropriation for county purposes be read a second and third time, signed, sealed and entitled a by-law as in the original motion, carried.

Smelser-Buckley—That a by-law be introduced and read a first time to authorize the Warden and Clerk to sign an agreement with the Union Bank of Canada for the borrowing of \$75,000 for good roads purposes, carried.

Buckley-Smelter—That the Clerk be authorized to give the names of the auctioneers who have taken out licenses for the county of Haldimand for 1919 and report at the next meeting of the county council, also junk dealers, carried.

Pyle-Sawle—That we do now adjourn to meet on July 10, 1919, at 10 o'clock a.m. carried.
