The Youngest Major

Major W. M. Nickle, aide-de-camp to Gen. Sir Richard Turner, who recently returned to Canada, has the distinction of being probably the youngest major in the Canadian Corps, for he is just 22. He is a son of the member of Parliament for Kingston, and enlisted in March, 1915, as a private in the P.P.C.L.I. He was given his commission on the field, and the following year he was wounded at St. Eloi, and won the Military Cross at Vimy Ridge. He recovered from his wounds in Canada, and rejoined the 21st Battalion in 1917, and was promoted to captain. In the following year he was made aide-de-camp at Argyll House, and given his majority. He now returns to Canada to study law.
