### Obituary

On Sunday evening, Sept. 28th 1919 there passed peacefully to rest, Sarah Jane Craig, relict of the late John McCarter, Sr. one of the few remaining pioneer settlers of the County of Haldimand. Although reaching the great age of almost ninety years her death came unexpectedly to her relatives and neighbors as her illness of but a few days was not apparently serious.

Mrs. McCarter, who was the oldest resident of Jarvis, also the oldest member of Knox Church was born at Newry Village, County Armagh, Ireland in 1830. She came to Canada in 1843 and settled on the farm, Lot 1, Con 9 in the Township of Walpole with her husband in 1848 where she lived for nearly fifty years, moving to the village in the winter of '97 with her daughter Sadie and son Charles.


