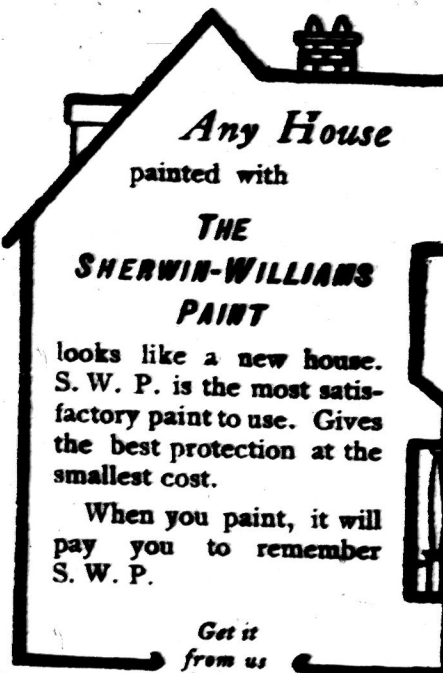

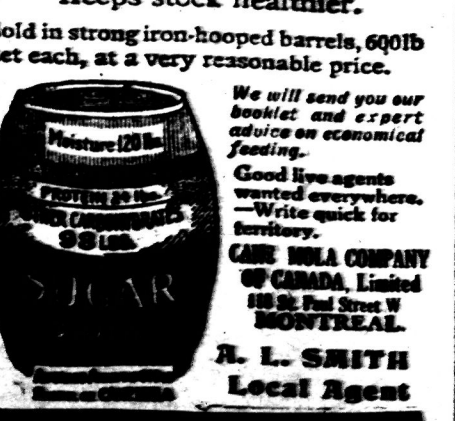

brother of deceased, received a dislocated shoulder and badly cut face.

The accident happened at the McGill track, when an automobile containing a number of employees of the Brandon Shoe Company of Brantford plunged at right angles into the car driven by Dr. Charles Duncombe. Both cars were wrecked, the occupants being strewn about the road. A cornfield at the corner, intervened, causing the drivers to lose sight of each other. Both were going at a good speed at the time of the accident.

The Brantford motor ambulance was rushed to the scene, and conveyed the three injured to the city. Dr. Duncombe of St. Thomas, accompanied by his wife, who was only shaken up, died on his way to the hospital.

All the occupants in the Brandon Company car escaped serious injury. County Constable Kerr, who investigated the accident, announced to-night that an inquest would be held on the order of the Crown Attorney, although relatives of the deceased doctor in the city had been disinclined toward an investigation. The name of the driver of the car which ran into that of Dr. Duncombe was not available to the Crown authorities Monday night.
