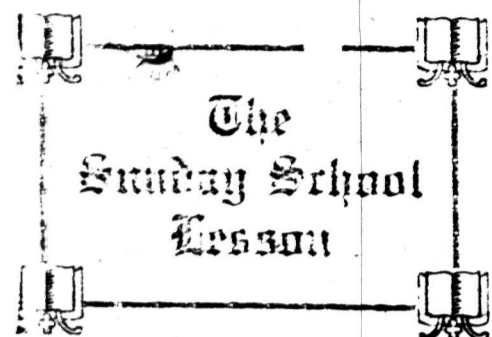

THE GROWTH OF THE KINGDOM
 Lesson—Matt. 13: 1-43. Printed Text—Matt. 13: 24-33.
 Golden Text—"Fret not thyself because of evil-doers" (Ps. 37: 1).
Historical Setting.
 Time.—A. D. 23. Place.—Galilee.

Comments.
 Verse 24. All the Lakeside parables were delivered shortly after the ed. But it is on the day of judgment that the separation is to be made (vs. 49-43).
 Verse 27. The teaching of this verse is plain upon one point. The evil that is in the world is not of God's sowing. It comes from the hand of an enemy. Some have believed that this passage bears directly upon the question of discipline in the church, but the point of comparison lies in the separation that will take place at the "end of the world."
 Verse 29. Often the roots of the wheat and the tares become so interwoven that they pull up together.
 Verse 30. It is possible to strain this parable beyond the point of comparison. For instance, good people in the church may so influence the bad that the latter may become good. There used to be a superstition that tares turned to wheat, but that is impossible. It must be remembered that the point of comparison is not in one delivery of the Sermon on the Mount. A parable teaches by comparing a spiritual truth with something familiar in human experience. It differs from a fable in that a parable is always possible, while a fable is not. The good seed, as represented by "sons of the kingdom," is the truth. The tares are falsehoods, as represented by the "sons of the evil one." The field is the world.
 Verse 25. Tares are a noxious weed that at first resemble wheat. It is not until harvest-time that it may be safely weeded out. Good and evil are often hard to distinguish in the church, and the effort to separate them often fails.
 Verse 26. Here is an illustration of Jesus' statement, "By their fruits ye shall know them." When wheat becomes ripe and the tares become ripe they are easily distinguish-

turning to the other, but in final separation.
 Verse 31.—In the first two of this group of parables we learn the strength of the kingdom's adversaries, and in the two now to be considered we learn the kingdom's own strength. In the first two is described the combat between the kingdom of righteousness and the kingdom of evil, and here we learn the victory of righteousness over evil.
 Verse 32. The mustard seed was the smallest which the common people were ordinarily familiar with in Palestine. The point of comparison, however, is not in the size of the seed, but in great growth from small beginnings.
 Verse 33. To express this parable in words that we now use, the leaven is yeast and the meal is of flour, represents society in general. Therefore, the kingdom is the agency of the active spiritual agency—which brings life to men. Illustrated Truth.
 The activity of the forces of righteousness are likely to be a signal for activity on the other side (vs. 28).
 Illustration.—The organized bodies, that have for their object the protection of evil, all had their origin in the activity of the other side. Who believes the "Personal Liberty League" would ever have come into existence if there had not been an "Anti-Saloon League"? Infield societies have sprung up in the wake of great revivals, not because the latter created them, but because the sleeping seeds of evil broke their bonds and began ground with the already expanding forces of the kingdom.

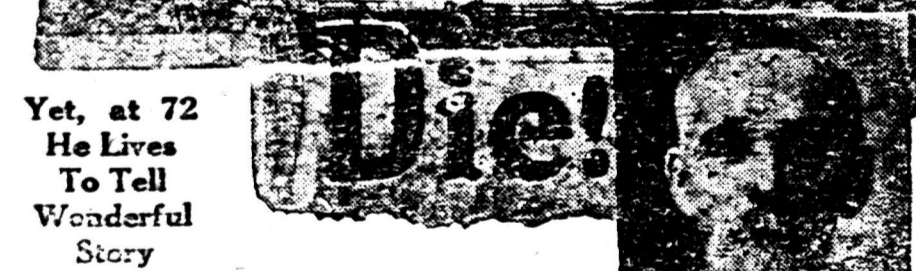

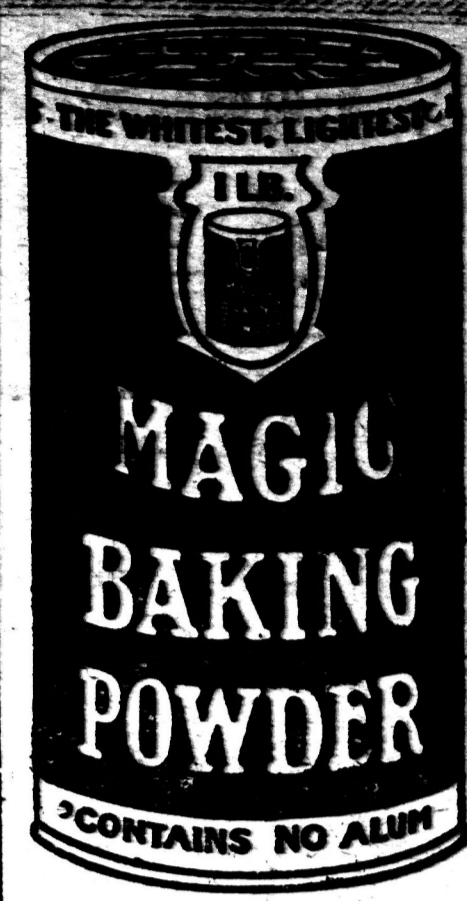

LIVE STOCK REPORTS
TORONTO (Union Stock Yards).—The heaviest receipts of the year were unloaded at the Yards during the week. Cattle were in excess of eleven thousand, hogs totalled eight thousand and nine hundred and seven and sheep twelve thousand and seventy. In addition there were twenty-seven hundred and fifty-eight cattle, four hundred and twenty-one hogs and seventy-two sheep on through billing. On Monday, about five thousand cattle sales were made in which the better grades were weighed up at steady prices, and the common stuff at a reduction of 50 cents per hundred. The market remained at the new level during the remainder of the week. Good heavy steers sold from \$12 to \$12.50, medium from \$10 to \$11, and common from \$9 to \$10. Heavy weight butchers sold from \$10 to \$11.50 if of good grading and from \$8 to \$9.50, if common. Light weights of steers changed hands from \$5 to \$7. Cows of good grading moved generally from \$7 to \$8, and fair kinds from \$5 to \$6. These prices are from 50 cents to \$1 below the prevailing range during the previous week. Cattle were liquidated at \$3.50 and cutters from \$4 to \$4.50; choice bulls sold from \$8 to \$9 and common from \$5 to \$6. During the week, there were many farmers on the yards in search of choice feeding steers, but the supply of this quality was limited, and the purchasers had to fill their requirements with fair quality stock. It is expected that the stocker and feeder business will show considerable activity during the next two or three weeks. Choice feeding steers weighing from eight hundred pounds up sold at steady prices, sales being made from \$9 to \$11 per hundred. Light weight feeders of good quality moved from \$8 to \$9, and the common from \$6 to \$7. Milkers and Springers of good grading were in demand at steady prices, but the common kinds were off from \$15 to \$20 per head.
