The new automobile license prices are announced as follows :-

The greater part of the auto-owning public will be affected most by the first change, which increases the fee on passenger cars of not more than 25 horse power, with not more than four cylinders, from \$10 to \$13: car of the same horse power with six cylinders. \$15, eight to twelve cylinders, \$20; cars of from 25 to 35 horsepower with four cylinders, \$15, which is the same as before; 25 to 35 horsepower, with six cylinders, \$20; eight to twelve cylinders, \$25; cars with 35 to 50 horsepower, four cylinders, \$20; six cylinders, \$30; eight to twelve cylinders, \$35; over fifty horsepower, four cylinders \$30: six cylinders. \$35; eight to twelve evlinders, \$40.
