Wyandotte King

John S. Martin, of Port Dover Wins at Kansas City.

Simcoe, Dec. 5.—John S. Martin has just returned from Kansas City with his birds, exhibited at the "Heart of America" Poultry Show, where he sustained his title as "Wyandotte King of America."

The Kansas City Journal says in part: "The biggest single winning was made John S. Martin of Port Dover, Ont., Canada. In the White Wyandotte breed, Martin won first prize in all six classes: hens, pullets, cocks, cockerels, young pens and old pens."

As a matter of fact, Mr. Martin, who is delighted with this, his grandest success, won first to eighth on cock birds, first to eighth on hens, first to twelfth on cockerels, and first to ninth on pullets. Not one of his birds was beaten.

His winnings amounted to over \$500. His champion bird was photographed for the movies, and the "King" himself was induced to pose for a film. Mr. Martin observed: "I have worked hard for it."

Mr. Martin carried \$12,000 transportation insurance on his exhibit. He has in his pens now about 6,000 birds. There were 2,500 birds in the show.
