

And, whereas, on that account actions for damages from accidents upon highways are multiplying at a rate that is causing much anxiety and much concern as to the fairness of the present law regarding liabils ity of municipalities for accidentupon highways as they apply to rural municipalities;

And, whereas, the question has been referred to a Special Committee of the County Council of the County of Kent to consider the matter and report at the January

And, whereas, the Special Committee has met and carefully considered the matter and are of the opi ion that the present law is quite unfair and unduly burdensome upon the rural municipalites, and that a combined effert should be made by County Councils on behalf of all the rural municipalities in Ontario to procure such amendments as will put the law upon a more equitable

Be it therefore resolved, that with a view to having the matter generally discussed at the January Sessions of County Councils, and with a view to having joint action taken on behalf of all rural municipalities in the Province that this Committee adopt the following suggestions:

1. That the present law be amended so that the liability of rural municipalities for accidents upon highways be limited to cases in which the county or township is guilty of gross negligence, and that gross negligence shall not be deem-(Concluded on Page 8)
