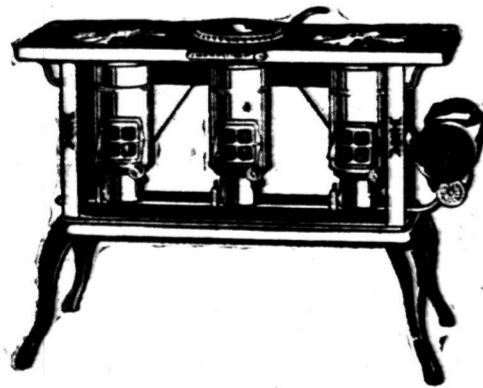

He Claims Simcoe Lands

A few days ago an elderly gentleman stepped off the trolley at Simcoe and asked the way to Dean's hotel. He came up town to the old McNally house, now used as an apartment house, and took a room. He proved to be a son of the late David Abel, well-known here sixty years ago, and a grandson of the late William Abel, who came to Simcoe about 1840, and purchased in the George Kent survey that strip of land lying south of the market square between Talbot and Head streets. The man wore a detective badge, and during his twenty-four hours in town changed his street apparel more than once. He claimed that the land above mentioned does not belong to the present occupants, but to the heirs of the Abel estate, four of whom he looked up while in town. The little frame house originally erected on the property was for years occupied by Edward Husband. It has been remodelled since, but is still there. Committed for Trial

The jury at the inquest into the death of Louis D. Thilman, who was shot while selling tickets at the circus at Dunnville, brought in the following verdict:

"That Louis D. Thilman came to his death as a result of bullets fired by Joseph Apert on the night of May 26th, 1920, in the town of Dunnville, Ontario, and that from the evidence produced that shooting was done with malice aforethought.

The prisoner was committed for trial at the next court of competent jurisdiction. Apert was taken to Cayuga jail on Thursday.
