M. DESCHANEL TO THE ALLIES

French President Calls for Allegiance to Oath. Says Germany is Still a Menace.

Paris Cable—President Deschanel calls on Great Britain, France and the United States to hold to their oaths of triple friendship, if surprises as manifest in recent events, in Germany, are not to result in the fruits of victory and in danger to the peace of the world.

In conversations with the correspondents after the address, President Deschanel denied that France has a particularistic or imperialistic end in view, prepared herself for defence against the German menace, which is pointing a revolver at her heart.

Like his illustrious predecessor, Poincare, President Deschanel does not disguise his distrust of the German, for which he has ample justification at this crisis in the world's history.

Whether the German disorders indicate camouflage or not, the French President is apprehensive of troubles ahead, owing to the pronounced check that Germany plans for readjustment have received. French official circles are apparently as much impressed with the influence of the German

ALIENS FIGHT FOR FREEDOM. When Held for Deportation in Detroit. One Man Shot and Others Injured.

DETROIT, Mich., Report—One man was shot and several others received minor injuries late today when a number of aliens held at Fort Wayne army post for deportation hearings, attempted to overpower their guards.

Immigration officers said the attempted escape was probably due to the return to the barracks to-day of nine prisoners who were ringleaders in a hunger strike and plans for an "insurrection" a week ago. Four hundred prisoners are in custody at the fort.

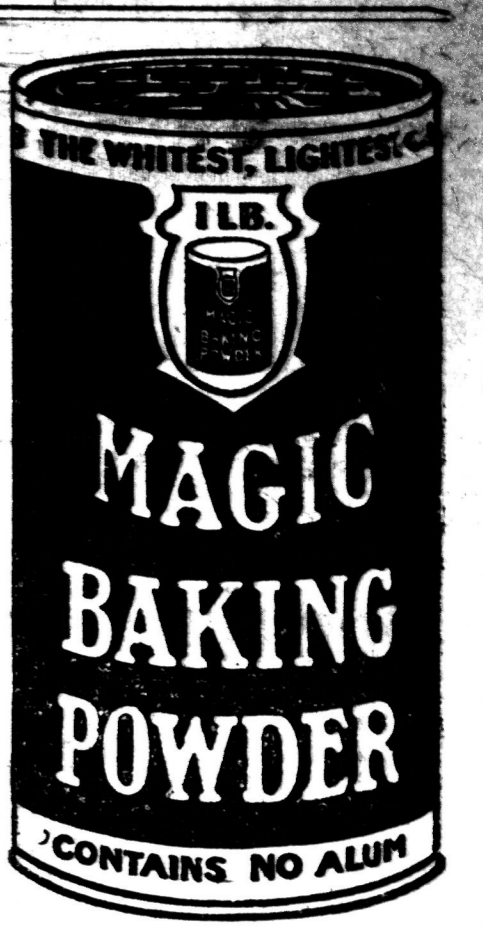

KAISER'S PLEDGE NOT SUFFICIENT

Dutch Gov't. Rapped in House for Its Course. Count Can Cross Frontier at Any Time.

Amerongen Cable—The former German Emperor remained up last night long after the others in Bentinck Castle had gone to bed. News of the failure of the Kapp revolution reached him in the evening.

The Hague, March 18.—The Dutch Government was taken severely to task for what was decided to be its leniency towards the former German Emperor in a debate in the Second Chamber of Parliament yesterday, when the Premier announced a decree limiting Count Hohenzollern's movements and his pledge not to mix in politics.

Deputy Schaper, Socialist, whose questions brought about announcement of the decree, said he was dissatisfied with the Premier's answer as a mere slight increase in the guards about the former Emperor was not enough, and Count Hohenzollern's pledge not sufficient. He said there were plenty of opportunities for the friends of the exile to bring him letters, and asked why visitors to the von Bentinck castle were not searched.

The Premier, in answer, referred to his letter to both Houses of Parliament, informing them of the assurance obtained from Count Hohenzollern that he would refrain from all political activity and do nothing which would involve Holland in any international difficulty. He added that similar action with reference to the former Crown Prince had been considered.

Deputy von Ravenstein, Communist, declared that the Government's policy of silence had strengthened the general belief that the former Emperor came to Holland originally with the intention of seeking approval of Hohenzollern, he said, had been permitted to live the quiet, easy life of a retired country gentleman, with a motor car at his disposal, in which he could cross the frontier any time he saw fit.

The same also could be said, Deputy von Ravenstein continued, about the former Crown Prince, who could maintain communication with the reactionary party in Germany. Other persons whom the Government considered undesirable were imprisoned and maltreated in concentration camps, even when provided with good passports, the Deputy asserted.
