## ELIAS BOUGHNER DIES FROM BURNS

Veteran Norfolk County Clerk Passes Away.

SIMCOE, April 29—Elias Boughner, who for 29 years had been clerk of the County of Norfolk, died last midnight at his home, Colborne street. He never recovered from injuries received recently in a gas explosion in one of the records vaults at the county buildings.

Elias Boughner was a stalwart of Windham Township. Physically, intellectually and at heart he was a big man. Reared in the humility of the farm home of three-quarters of a century ago, he rose to the distinction of schoolmaster, became a student of economics, municipal law and politics. He sat in the County Council of Norfolk more than 40 years ago and he twice contested North Norfolk for the local House in the interests of the Conservative party and on each occasion he took a big slice out of a previous majority.

He was the orator of his generation in Norfolk and he gloriied in debate. It is often recalled how, before a full audience in the courthouse here in one of the elections he opposed Hon. G. W. Ross in debate. He sat silently through the minister's harangue and then proceeded to metaphorically mop the floor with the orator from Queen's Park. Mr. Ross lamented later that he had not come prepared.

A few days prior to the accident he had just penned off a three column article outlining the work and development of the Norfolk industrial farm over a period of 80 years. He was as active as many men at 50 and did all his office work without the aid of spectacles.

His name in Norfolk has been a synonym for honor, integrity and competence. He had passed his 75th year. He leaves a wife and one son, John M. Boughner, of Wynndham, and one daughter, Miss Alice, of Guelph, who has been home during his illness.

The funeral was held on Friday last, interment in Oakwood cemetery.
