BY-LAW NO. 59 OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF JARVIS

A By-law to authorize and empower The Dominion Natural Gas Company, Limited, to charge increased prices for the sale and distribution of Natural Gas within the Village of Jarvis.

WHEREAS, by By-law Number 58 of the Village of Jarvis, passed on the seventh day of May, 1918, certain rights and privileges to sell and distribute natural gas for the purposes of heat, light and power within the said Village of Jarvis, were granted to the Dominion Natural Gas Company, Limited, hereinafter referred to as the Company, for the period of twenty-five years from the date of the passing of the said By-law, as in the said By-law is more particularly set forth.

AND WHEREAS, in order to obtain an adequate supply of natural gas for continuing the sale and distribution thereof within the said Village of Jarvis it is necessary for the Company to incur a large expenditure in sinking additional natural gas wells within the County of Haldimand, and the Company have requested that power and authority be given to it by a By-law of the said Village of Jarvis authorizing the Company to charge increased prices for the natural gas hereafter supplied by the said Company within the said Village of Jarvis for the purposes aforesaid.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to grant the request of the said Company subject to the conditions herein-after set forth.

AND WHEREAS the granting of the right to the said Company to charge such increased prices upon the terms and conditions provided for and hereinafter set forth has been duly assented to by the Municipal Electors of the Village of Jarvis, as provided for by the Municipal Act.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis, as follows:

1. For Natural Gas furnished and distributed by the Company for the purposes of heat, light and power and any other purpose within the said Village of Jarvis under the powers granted under the said By-law Number 58 aforesaid of the Village of Jarvis, from and after the coming into effect of this By-law the Company shall be entitled to charge the price of forty-five cents per thousand cubic feet, or a price equal to, but not exceeding, the prevailing rate from time to time hereafter by the Company charged domestic consumers in the County of Haldimand, whichever is the greater rate.

2. This By-law shall take effect after having received the assent of the electors, and after the Company shall have formally accepted the same by entering into an agreement in writing under seal with the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Jarvis upon the terms and to the effect and containing the conditions and provisions set forth in the agreement contained in Schedule "A" hereto, and the Reeve and Clerk of the Corporation of the said Village of Jarvis are hereby authorized and required to execute the same on behalf of the Corporation and to affix thereto its Corporate Seal upon the same being executed by the Company, within thirty days after the final passing hereof, and this By-law shall not come into effect until the Company shall have entered into such agreement in writing under seal with the Corporation.

3. That all existing agreements entered into between the said Company and the said Corporation, and the provisions of said By-law Number 58 of the said Corporation, except as to the price of gas which the Company may charge as provided by this By-law, and except as otherwise provided by this By-law, shall be and continue in force and be binding for all purposes and to the same intent as if this By-law had not been enacted and passed.

4. The Company shall repay to the Corporation the costs, charges and expenses of the Solicitor of the Corporation and of incidental to the drawing and passing of this By-law and of obtaining the assent of the ratepayers thereof and of the agreement hereinafter provided for.

SCHEDULE "A" REFERRED TO IN THE BY-LAW HERETO ANNEXED

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made and entered into (in duplicate) this day of A.D. 1920, BETWEEN:

THE DOMINION NATURAL GAS COMPANY, LIMITED, a body corporate and politic organized under the laws of the Province of Ontario, hereinafter called the "Company,"

OF THE FIRST PART,

AND—
THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF JARVIS, hereinafter called the "Corporation."

OF THE SECOND PART.

WHEREAS the Council of the said Corporation on the day of 1920, passed a By-law granting to the Company certain rights and privileges with regard to the price payable for the production, sale and distribution of natural gas for the purpose of light, heat and power, and any other purpose within the limits of the said Village of Jarvis, subject to the terms, conditions and stipulations, provisions and things therein contained, a copy of which said By-law is hereto annexed:

AND WHEREAS these presents are intended to give effect to said By-law; NOW THESE PRESENTS WITNESSETH that in consideration of the premises and of the granting of the rights and privileges and franchises, which are by the said By-law granted by the Corporation to the Company, the Company for itself, its successors and assigns hereby covenants, promises and agrees to and with the Corporation, and agrees to and with the Company as follows, that is to say:

1. That the Company do hereby accept such By-law, and that the Company, its successors and assigns will in all things conform to, obey and perform, observe, fulfill and keep all and every the terms, conditions, agreements, stipulations, provisions and things in said By-law contained, which said rights and privileges are, by the said By-law granted to the Company, and will do and perform all sets, matters and things which the said By-law provides are to be done by or on behalf of the Company.

2. And the Corporation do hereby ratify and confirm the said By-law and the rights and privileges thereby granted to the Company, subject however, to all the terms, conditions, agreements, stipulations, obligations and conditions and things in the said By-law contained.

3. And the Corporation covenants with the Company, its successors and assigns that the Corporation will not repeal, alter or amend the said By-law, or the rights and privileges thereby granted without the consent in writing of the Company, provided, and so long as the Company is not in default in observing, performing and keeping the covenants and conditions thereby and hereby covenanted on the part of the Company to be observed, performed and kept.

4. The said By-law and this agreement shall extend to and be binding upon the successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the Corporation have caused to be affixed the Corporate Seal and the Reeve and the Company have caused to be affixed its Corporate Seal, and the Vice-President, and General Manager and Secretary have set their hands the day of the year above written.

BY-LAW NUMBER 59 OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF JARVIS

A By-law to provide for taking Votes of the Electors on a proposed By-law entitled "A By-law to authorize and empower The Dominion Natural Gas Company, Limited, to charge increased prices for the sale and distribution of Natural Gas within the Village of Jarvis," requires for its validity the assent of the Electors, and it is expedient and necessary to pass this By-law for the purpose of enabling the Electors to vote on the proposed By-law.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis:

1. The votes of the Electors of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis shall be taken on the said proposed By-law on the 9th day of November, A.D. 1920, between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon at the following places, and by the following Deputy Returning Officers, namely:

polling Place—Polling Sub-Division No. 1.

Jarvis—Andrew Rodgers, Deputy Returning Officer.

2. On the 8th day of November, A.D. 1920, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, the head of the Council of the said Corporation, or some member of said Council appointed for that purpose by resolution, shall attend at the Council Chamber in the said Municipality for the purpose of appointing, and if requested so to do, shall appoint by writing signed by him, two persons to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and promoting the pro-

posed By-law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and opposing the proposed By-law.

3. On the 10th day of November, A.D. 1920, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon at the Council Chamber in said Municipality, the Clerk of the said Municipality shall attend and sum up the votes given for and against the proposed By-law.

Dr. Alway and Mr. Forbes, of Waterford, represented the Norfolk Telephone Company, and Mr. La Patrie and Ashley the Bell Telephone Company.

The board agreed that the Erie Company was entitled to some increase, but did not give a decision as to the amount until the matter was laid before the full board.

"SIGHT UNSEEN" TRADE IS GAMBLE

Consumer Takes Long Chance When He Buys From the Mail Order House.

GENERALLY IS LOSING GAME

Method of Doing Business Is Very Different When You Purchase Goods From Your Home Merchant.

When you were a youngster, did you ever make a trade, "sight unseen"? Of course you did. What boy has not risked his jackknife or his choicest marble on such a proposition and how often has he repented of his rash deed when he discovered what he got in the trade? He generally found that the deal turned out to the advantage of the one who made the proposition.

There is a little of the gambling instinct in the blood of nearly every man, woman and child, but even the hardened gambler likes to get a "run for his money." The "sight unseen" proposition doesn't appeal to him in the least. There are thousands of people, however, who would be properly indignant if they were accused of being gamblers, who every day take a chance on the greatest gambling game in the world. And worse than that, they are risking their money on a "sight unseen" proposition.

When one of the thousands of persons who build up and keep up the great mail order houses of the country sends his money away to pay for some article that he has selected from the mail order catalogue, he is taking a chance on getting what he expects to get. The mail order house may be perfectly honest and still the purchaser stands a good chance of not getting what he expects to get. The mail order catalogues are filled with pictures that catch the eye. The descriptions are brief, as they must be described within the confines of one book. No matter how hard the mail order house might try to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, it would be an impossibility. The buyer is simply taking a chance.

With into a store in your home town and ask to see an article which you may have seen advertised in your home paper. What would anyone think of your business ability or your common sense if you walked into a store at home and said: "I saw a picture in the paper to-day of a suit which I liked very much. Please wrap up one for me. Here's the money." The merchant would think that you were crazy, but that is exactly what you do every time you send an order to a mail order house. You buy "sight unseen" and you haven't a ghost of a chance of getting your money back if the article is unsatisfactory when it reaches you.

How different is the proceeding when you go into the store in your own home town to buy a suit of clothes, or a stove or a yard of ribbon. You may have seen a picture of it in the merchant's advertisement in the home paper and you know that, as the merchant is reliable, you can count on the goods being as he represents them in his advertisement. But does he ask you to take his word for everything? Does he hide the article behind the counter and tell you that you can't even see it until you buy it and pay over the money for it? Hardly. If the article is not already in plain sight on the counter, the merchant produces it for your inspection. If it does not exactly suit you, he has others that are a little different and that he is glad to have you inspect.

Get Merchant's Guarantee.

Then, if it is a suit of clothes you are buying, or a piece of dress goods or a pair of socks, you may ask if the merchant will guarantee that it will wear as long as an article of that kind could be expected to wear and he will tell you either that he will guarantee it or that he will not. If he tells you that he will guarantee your money back or another suit or another pair of socks in its place if it doesn't wear like it should, for the merchant, besides being an honest man in most cases, cannot afford not to make his word good. He is dependent upon your business and that of others in his own community and he cannot afford to misrepresent his goods.

After having all this opportunity to see what you are buying, you take your suit or your stove or whatever it is you buy home or it is sent home for you without any delivery charges, and after you get home and take another look at it and decide you don't want it after all, you send it back. "Sight unseen" when you buy from your home merchant. You don't look at a picture of an article in a newspaper, read a short description of it, go to the post office and buy a money order with the instructions, "Send me a suit of clothes"—or a stove or whatever it may be—"and I'll pay your delivery man 50 cents for delivering it to me."

There's a world of difference in the two methods of doing business and it's not hard to figure out which is the best for the man who is doing the buying.
