Scientist Was a Spiritualist

PROF. JACKSON CRAWFORD, of Belfast, who has died suddenly from poisoning, was one of the strongest proponents of spiritualism in Great Britain and perhaps in the world. He was acknowledged to be a scientist of high standing, and when he issued a couple of books in which he asserted that he had actual scientific proof of the existence of spirits, and proceeded to give formidable testimony of the fact he attracted wide interest among all interested in the cult, whether as adepts or critics. The most remarkable of the claims set forth by Prof. Crawford was that he had weighed a medium in the course of a seance, and had found her to lose several pounds when in communication with spirits, and to regain the weight immediately afterwards. In one case a difference of weight of fifty pounds was reported. Prof. Crawford's theory, which was immediately accepted by believers, was that the spirit in some manner extracted fifty pounds avoirdupois from the medium, and that it was with this force that the miracles, such as the lifting of tables, etc., were effected.

But scientists laughed at the notion. They said that Prof. Crawford was simply another of the distinguished men of science, including Flammarion, Lombroso, Lodge, Crookes and Richet, who have been deceived by tricky mediums and only another illustration of the truth that when a scientist strays from his own field he is as easily hoodwinked as anybody else. In the July number of the English Review, Mr. Joseph McCabe deals rather harshly with the scientific men who have accepted spiritualism, and pays particular attention to Prof. Crawford. The Belfast professor made the acquaintance of a family named Golher in 1915. There were seven of them, all spiritualists, the most remarkable being a girl of 17. He thereupon began a series of experiments, which lasted for two years, the result being his book entitled, "Reality of Psychic Phenomena and Experiments in Psychical Science." Though Prof. Crawford and Sir William Barrett, who assisted at some of the seances, declared that the precautions taken by the investigators were such as to make fraud an impossibility, Mr. McCabe laughs at the idea.

He says that in similar conditions a modest conjurer without the use of even a hairpin could have done everything attributed to a spirit agency. The light was the customary red lantern which appears to have been specially designed by Providence for the protection of mediums. The sitters consisted of a family of seven people, all spiritualists, and Prof. Crawford, therefore, had 14 hands and 14 feet to control in an imperfectly lighted room, and Mr. McCabe notes that no two professors were ever able to control the hands and feet of Eusapia Palladino, most noted of latter-day mediums. The circle, in the centre of which was the table, is described as about five feet in diameter. Mr. McCabe comments, "A little consideration will show that the centre of the table was thus just at the distance where the chief medium's foot would be, if she chose to extend it, and that in the shadow of the table, no one could see whether her foot was extended or not." In these conditions a light table or footstool, weighing two pounds, was raised in the air to a height of four feet. It never was raised above that height and it was rather shaky.

So if it was possible for her to keep the upper part of her leg motionless while manipulating the table with her foot, he would be ignorant of the fact. The medium's reason for not permitting a closer investigation was that it would interfere with the "candle-light" which the spirit engineers manufactured out of the medium's body to lift the table. To take a photograph of the scene was similarly forbidden on the ground that it might injure the medium. Not having read Prof. Crawford's book, through we cannot say whether his critic gives a fair summary of what the professor claims to have accomplished. If he has, it must be admitted that nobody could be persuaded by it except those already prepared to accept spiritualism.
