



cession to the side road between lots 16 and 17, 3 1/2 miles." That the Township of Sherbrooke agree to repay all money paid them by way of grants under the Highway Improvement Act before any roads are built in the said Township, carried.

By law read second and third time and passed.

Yocom - Stevens—That this County Council here assembled heartily endorse the petition of the Canfield Community Board of Trade, the Dunnville Board of Trade and the Dunnville branch of the Ontario Motor League and that this petition be forwarded to the Hon. Minister of Public Works, carried.

The report of the Good Roads committee was adopted as follows:

- Petition from residents of Canboro in the vicinity of Darling Road asking that one mile be added to their allotment. The committee cannot see how they can recommend granting their request.
- Would recommend that by law 683 adding additional mileage to the County Highway system be amended to include Township of Sherbrooke with an allotment of 3 1/2 miles, also making a slight change in allotment of South Cayuga.
- Would recommend that the plans and specifications including the estimates and assessments for the proposed construction of a drain known as "Spring Creek Drain," on the New Credit Indian Reserve, to prevent the flooding of the County highway, be accepted.
- Would recommend that the Superintendent be instructed to make application for a grant of \$400 from the Indian Department on 1 1/2 miles of County road constructed last season on Indian Line west of Hagersville.
- Would recommend that Mr. John Knisley be paid the sum of \$40 for damages to field adjoining Nelles Corners quarry.
- That the request of the Deputation from Village of Cayuga to resurface Munsey street from road No. 17 to Norton street be granted.
- That the Warden and Messrs. Houser, Smelser and Doyle be delegates to the Ontario Good Roads Convention held in Toronto on March 2, 3 and 4.
- Would suggest that the Council meet again on Thursday, March 10.
- That the Treasurer be authorized to continue the same arrangement as last season with the Superintendent re emergency account carried in Union Bank, Hagersville and the Clerk be authorized to sign form of resolution authorizing Superintendent to sign checks on said account.
- That the Chairman and Superintendent be authorized to advertise and dispose of any second-hand machinery which the County does not require.
- That the Superintendent be authorized to purchase what oak plank he thinks will be needed for repairing of bridges and culverts.
- Your committee after going over the estimates submitted by the Superintendent have decided to recommend an expenditure on County highways in 1921 of \$120,000, as follows:

County roads, maintenance, new allotment	\$ 15,000 00
County roads, maintenance and construction, old allotment	60,000 00
Prov. highway, county share	45,000 00

Council adjourned to meet again on March 10 at 10 o'clock a.m.

Simcoe county council at its closing session passed a resolution calling upon the Government to refund to the municipalities the extra cost of printing the voters' lists owing to adding the names of legislative voters other than those on the municipal lists. One member said the voters' lists for the big towns would cost \$1200 to \$1500.
