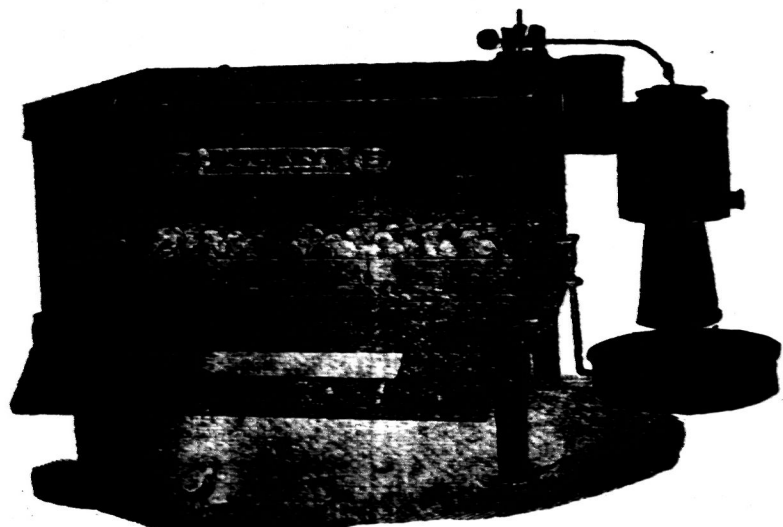

### Township and County Forests

The rapidity with which the scheme of the Ontario Government to reforest areas of non agricultural land in well settled counties is being taken up shows that the people are waking up in regard to the disappearance of timber forests. Along with the plan for a demonstration plantation of five acres in each township progress is now being made with the more ambitious scheme covering tracts of from five hundred to one thousand acres under the ownership of counties. The counties of York, Ontario, Simcoe and Norfolk have already started on the plan, and other counties and even some urban municipalities are discussing the acquiring of a municipal forest in this way.
