THE GREAT WILD MAYO

Imported by Sir Adam Beck. Now Stabled at E. S. Reid's in This Village.

Wild Mayo is an exceptionally fine Irish Hunter. He was bred in Ireland and was imported by Sir Adam Beck a few years ago. This horse is a very fine specimen of an Irish hunter and stands 16 hands 3 inches high and weighs 1300 lbs.

Wild Mayo was a successful winner of premiums, given at the Royal Stallion Horse Show at Islington Gardens, London, England, carrying off this much coveted prize several successive years. As many as 240 stallions are exhibited for this premium at the annual show held there in March, and the fact that only horses of the highest type of this class are awarded the premium shows the superiority of Wild Mayo for breeding hunters. This premium is a guarantee to breeders that this sire is a suitable horse to produce high class hunters. The premium is well known as the King's certificate and the show itself is held under the Royal patronage of His Majesty King George V.

At the present time Sir Adam Beck has a number of very promising colts sired by Wild Mayo in his stables. They include 12 four-year olds, 8 three-year olds, several two-year olds and yearlings. The four-year olds will be shown this fall at leading horse shows in Canada and the United States. The three-year olds are considered the best on this continent.
