INDIANS SENTENCED

Sherry and Henry Plead Guilty

Simcoe, May 27.—For assaulting with intent to rob, while armed, Hilton Tuscarora Indians, were tried before Judge Boles to-day. They pleaded guitty and were sentenced to Portsmouth penitentiary, Sherry for eight years and Henry for six years.

The Indians had attempted to rob Joseph Howard, merchant, of Hartford Village, on the border of the reserve. but Howard when attacked in his stable by night, gave battle, was shot in the shoulder, but got the revolver and the caps and masks of the men.

In giving sentence his honor told the soners that he had fully considered their youth, each about 23 years old, their war service and their nationality. but was bound to give sufficient sentence
