### Rainham Holstein Makes Big Record

Snowball Princess Aaggie 2nd, H.F. H.B. 41477, owned and bred by Lanson C. Moerschfelder, Selkirk, has recently completed an official record 30.99 lbs. butter from 568.9 lbs milk; in 15 days 64.67 lbs. of butter from 1267.2 lbs. milk; highest day's milk 90 lbs. Four other cows in the herd have made nearly as creditable records. One, Rattler Heifer, as a junior 2-year-old produced nearly 20 lbs. of butter in 17 days, and gave as high as 62 lbs. of milk in one day. She is sired by a half brother to L. D. King Colantha, the present herd sire, which is sired by one of the best sons of Colantha Johanna Lad, world's greatest proven producing and transmitting sire. This heifer has recently been sold at a good figure.

### Anniversary of Sir John A's Death

St. Thomas Times-Journal—Thirty years ago on Monday, June 6th, Sir John A. Macdonald, one of the most notable in Canadian national history, died in Ottawa. Early in May, 1891, he had suffered a slight stroke of paralysis, but recovered sufficiently to resume his parliamentary duties, appearing for the last time in the House of Commons on the 22nd of that month. Increasing weakness and a return of partial paralysis within the next two or three days made him conscious that his time on earth was brief, and he met the inexorable call with a calm and quiet dignity. After fixing finally the disposition of his property, he continued to interest himself in public business till May 29, when a further stroke brought unconsciousness. In that condition he lingered till June 6, when his strenuous life came to a quiet end. His passing became at once a national concern with every evidence of public sorrow. In accordance with his own desire, his remains were conveyed with imposing ceremony and amid unparalleled demonstrations of popular respect and affection to Kingston, where they were reverently laid to rest beside the grave of his mother in Cataract cemetery.

### TAX PLACED ON LAND DEEDS

**One-fifth of One Per Cent. Must Be Paid—Went into Effect June 1.**

Of special interest to everyone who deals in real estate is the new land transfer tax, the particulars of which have been obtained by Dr. W. M. McGuire, the County Registrar. The purpose of the new regulation is to provide another source of revenue for the Provincial Treasury.

The pith of the Act, by which the new tax has been made valid, is here quoted: "A tax of one-fifth of one per cent, upon the amount of the purchase price shall be paid by the party registering the same upon every transfer, conveyance, deed, instrument and writing whereby any land-tenements or other realty sold shall be granted, assigned, transferred or otherwise conveyed to or vested in the purchaser or purchasers, or in any other person or persons by his, her or their direction."

Such tax shall be collected by the registrar, before he registers such transfer, and any registrar shall be entitled to retain to his own use two per centum of the moneys collected by him under Section 2 thereof.

The registrar shall within the first week of each month send to the Treasurer of Ontario a statement of the amount collected during the previous month, and shall pay over the amount thereof less the percentage provided for in Section 3 thereof, to the Treasurer of Ontario for the uses of Ontario.

It will be noticed that the tax is not to be computed upon the amount named in the transfer as the consideration, but on the actual purchase price as sworn by the purchaser in a special affidavit which he is required to make and file with the registrar. The tax must be paid before the deed is registered. The act does not apply to any transfer where an agreement for sale of the land has already been registered. It came into effect on the first day of June. Lawyers and conveyancers in the county will receive copies of the act.

Hon. Peter Smith, the Provincial Treasurer, is the author of the measure.—Simcoe Reformer.
