Hatching eggs should be stored in V. 17. The covenant formed at the tankage or roots if you have them or will start a slow germination and even a slight chilling may weaken the germ so the egg will not hatch. If hatching eggs are held several days before setting, it is best to turn them each day, after the third day. It pays to remember that the fresher the eggs the greater the chance for a good hatch
