Important Events Which Have Occurred During the Week.

WEDNESDAY.

Britain severs diplomatic relations with Greece.  
Sir George Minister of Greece executed at Athens.  
C. P. E. net earnings set new record in October.  
Turkeys drop to 45 cents a pound on Chicago market.  
Denial of free zone in Italy to Henry Ford is made.  
British Labor M. P. is ordered to withdraw from Commons.  
Deadlock occurs at Lausanne conference over Turk demands.  
King Solomon Masonic Lodge, Toronto, recipient of valued gift.  
Big effort being made in U. S. Senate to kill anti-lynching bill.  
Sir Henry Thornton arrives to take up duties of president of C. N. R.  
French Premier looks for reparations agreement at Brussels meeting.  
Heavy grain shipments from head of lakes indicates surpassing of 1915 record.  
Toronto students suggest League of Students, representative of all civilized methods of handling cash revealed at inquiry into York township shortages.  
Principal of Technical School, Toronto, claims priority in Canada of teachers of arts subject.  
First Principal, a Manitoba Clydesdale stallion, wins grand championship at the Royal Winter Fair.  
Banks which held up, beat and robbed Port William storekeeper are sent to penitentiary for ten years.  
Good Roads Association asks that another twenty millions be granted by the Dominion to aid highway construction.  
Witnesses appearing in the Blanche Garneau murder are granted immunity by Quebec authorities even if they are implicated in the crime.  
T. & N. O. Railway will be completed to James Bay in 1926 or 1927, it is announced, but electrification of road will not be gone on with at present.  
Heirs to Hamilton man face problem of disposing of stock of liquor, some of which is known to have been poisoned by deceased, who alone knew which bottles were doctored.
