EFFICIENT FARMING

Alert Revival in Hog Raising.

This winter has witnessed an alert revival of interest in hog raising as a source of steady revenue especially for the mixed farm.

One fact which, no doubt, will greatly surprise the majority of hog raisers is that only a little over one-half of the number purchased by most packers in Ontario and Quebec can be graded into the desired weights set by the Ottawa conference for select bacon hogs.

The desired weights of 160 to 210 lbs. alive at the packing plant means roughly 170 to 220 lbs. at the farm.

Dry Formaldehyde to Prevent Oak Smut.

Place the oats to be tested in a pile on the granary or barn floor and then shovel them over into another pile and as they are being shoveled over spray them with a solution consisting of one part of formalin (40 per cent formaldehyde solution) to one part of water.

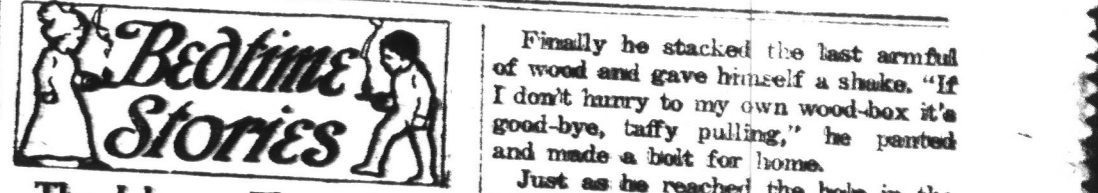
