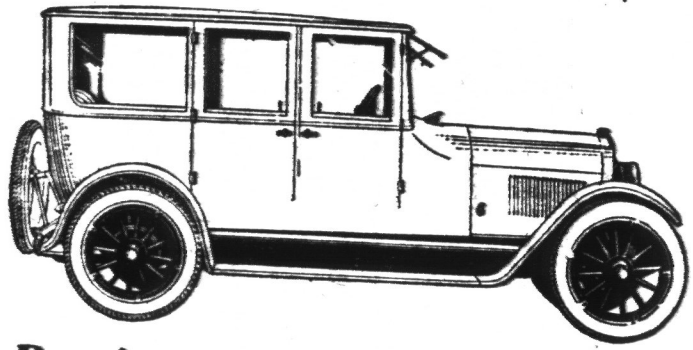

**FAMOUS DOUBLES.**

**Noted Men Have Had Peculiar Experiences.**

The sensational story that the tsar and tsarevitch are both living in Japan under the protection of the mikado has been proved to be false by the discovery of secret papers found in the Winter Palace after the removal of the tsar to Moscow.  
From these papers it seems that the ex-tsar had been in the habit for some years before his abdication of employing a "double" to impersonate him on state and other occasions when the strain of public functions, with all their pomp and ceremonial, were too much for him.  
The "double" he used was an officer of the Siberian Rifles, whose appearance was so like that of the tsar that it was almost impossible for anyone to tell them apart. This officer is known to have escaped to Japan, and from this fact the extraordinary rumor arose.  
The possession of doubles by famous men has given rise to many awkward and sometimes amusing situations.  
King Edward had several doubles, some of whom were mistaken for his Majesty on various occasions. One of them, Lord Verulam, underwent this somewhat embarrassing experience, being followed through the town by cheering crowds. Then there was the Parisian who was the exact double of King George's father, and who dressed and played the part to perfection. He walked the streets, and was saluted everywhere by

those who knew him, as well as by those who didn't.

Sir John French was alleged to have served cigarettes in a small shop in Armentieres during the war, and the shopkeeper was saluted by British soldiers in wondering astonishment until he declared in broken English, "You have made the same error as many others. I am Henri Harriot, as my signboard declares."  
Once when Mr. Gladstone was making one of his whirlwind tours in Scotland Mr. George Hodgman, a noted devotee of the turf, was leaving Waverley Station, Edinburgh, and was mistaken for the G. O. M. It was not long before a crowd gathered and demanded a speech.  
Just as the train was moving off "Mr. Gladstone," with his head out of the window, raised his hat, and said, with due solemnity, "Gentlemen, I thank you very much. So-and-so will win the Cesarewitch." Then he sat back in his seat, leaving the crowd very much astonished.

**PRESENTS TO MARSHAL FOCH.**

Medals, Degrees, Wild Cat. Pig

When he sailed from New York after an extensive tour of the United States and Canada, Marshal Ferdinand Foch almost had to charter a ship to carry away the presents that had been made to him on the North American continent.  
In his voluminous baggage were six great cases filled with gifts from the people who thronged to see him during his tour, and lend their voices in acclamation of the man who hurled Germany's legions back from the soil of France and won victory in history's greatest conflict. Since coming to America late in October, Marshal Foch had traveled nearly 175,000 miles, made more than 500 speeches, attended luncheons and banquets beyond computation and had heard the acclamation of upwards of 17,000,000 men, women and children.  
Everywhere he had received gifts. Here it was an honorary college degree, there a medal of gold or a trinket or two, and yonder a pet or a flower, or maybe just a wisp of token of esteem, admiration and love. He betrayed the fact, with the receiving of each of the gifts, that his heart was touched, and each one was with him when he boarded the liner Paris for home.  
His luggage included a score and a half of parchments, attesting he had been accorded honorary degrees by leading universities and colleges. There was one crate full of Montana wild cat, of the bob-tailed, spitting, but not very dangerous type, presented by American Legionaries. Another crate contained a White Chester pig, from Iowa, also Legion gift. There was a whole box of medals and medallions; a golden and jeweled sword in a golden scabbard; a gold-headed cane, and a half-dozen or so of loving cups. A union brick-layer's card was to be found in the marshal's possessions also.  
The sword, gift of the French Institute of America, bore the arms of the United States, of France and of the Institute. Encircling the hilt were seven sapphires, the handle was of carved ivory and was inscribed with the marshal's golden monogram.  
Crow Indians had dubbed the marshal "Warrior of Warriors" and made him a full-fledged chief. Sioux, once the terrors of the northern plains, gave him a war bonnet, bestowed only upon the bravest of the brave, and called him "Chief Watapech Wakliya," or "Charging Thunder." And out in a little town of Indiana—where the marshal's special train stopped for a few moments—he received from a war-faced little woman a potted geranium.  
"Take it," she implored, "and plant it on the grave of my son. He fell near Soissons."  
The geranium has been carefully preserved and will be planted by Marshal Foch in his own garden "in honor of the son of the little woman of Indiana."
