Second Session

FIRST DAY

Cayuga Thursday, Feb. 16, 1922. Council met pursuant to adjournment. All members present. The Warden in the Chair.

4. Hon. Mr. Raney, acknowledging receipt of letter asking for Javelle Court.

5. Minister of Public Works, acknowledging receipt of resolution asking Province to bear expenses of County bridges.

6. Department of Public Highways acknowledging receipt of returns of total expenditure for 1921.

7. Telegram from Deputy Minister of Highways, re County Road Superintendents, meeting.

8. Letter from National Sanitarium Association re grant.

9. Letter from Standard Bank re John Simms' account.

10. Letter from Charles Butler re securing farm settlers in England.

By-law read second and third time and passed.

Glenny-Hamilton—That we do now adjourn to allow the different committees to meet. carried.

Buckley-Brown—That we resume business with the Warden in the chair. carried.

Buckley-Houser—That the report of the special committee on communications be received and read. carried.
