## NEWS TOPICS OF WEEK

Important Events Which Have Occurred During the Week

**The Busy Week's Happenings Generally Completed and Put Into Handy and Attractive Shape for the Readers of Our Paper - A Solid Hour's Enjoyment.**

### WEDNESDAY.

British lacrosseists sail for home. Bishops in England debate heresy. Canada defaults in Davis Cup series. British vice-consul shot on Chinese battlefield. Detroit merchants accept Canadian dollar at par. Irish rebels continue raids on banks in cities. Michigan-Ontario baseball season opened to-day. Canadian newspaper men are optimistic about conditions. Rival Chinese armies engage in fighting on a long front. Powers will subscribe fund to finance Russia's industries. Politicians of France again threaten to wreck Genoa Conference. Provincial rights upheld by Railway Committee of Commons. Open war between Free State and rebel begins in Ireland. "Pepper" Martin knocks out "Babe" Herman in first round. The Dewar budget amendment was defeated in the Legislature. Hamilton unemployed refuse to take jobs, say Wrenworth. A bill to amend the Cold Storage Act was introduced in the Senate. 737.50 to improve breed of cattle. C. V. Street was found guilty in Toronto of causing a girl's death. Two street cars crash at Toronto, motor men and a passenger were hurt. A young couple were drowned when their canoe upset in the Magog river, Quebec. C. P. H. vice-president, on return from England, says Mr. Larkin fights striking longshoremen clash with Montreal police, and two officers are fatally wounded. George Forth, a well-known farmer of Nelson township, drowns himself in water tank. Woodstock citizens are irate over the shooting of a young man who was trying to escape from Burwash.

### THURSDAY.

Greeks and Turks want to renew fight. Willard wants to box Dempsey again. Decision at Hamilton aids liquor export. Rio de Janeiro likely to have martial law. Reading Marines beat the Leafs, 12 to 2. Unemployed women raid Vancouver relief office. Tide of battle ebbs and flows in China war area. Liberal caucus agrees to big slash in militia expenditures. Miss Sterling will compete for the Canadian golf title. Bad flood in Brandon renders many families homeless. J. C. Clement of British Columbia dies from a stroke. Fighting in Kilkeenny ends in capture of Ormonde Castle. Fourteen-year-old school boy commits suicide at Detroit. Twelve teams may operate in the O. A. L. A. senior series. Russia, Bulgaria and Turkey are lining up under Germany. France and Belgium refuse to agree to proposal to Russia. London City Council denounces Drury's anti-Hydro policies. Bill Koleszynski of Detroit sold his entire family for one dollar. Edmonton will play London Shamrocks, L. O. E. champions. Shipping interests at Montreal want militia to protect property. Montreal Longshoremen's Union will expel men responsible for riot. Hon. G. H. Ferguson promises to produce a new temperance policy. Labor will hold a mass meeting in Toronto to protest Maguire's arrest. Premier Smith of South Africa sees wars in old world if Genoa fails.

### FRIDAY.

St. Louis beaten by Detroit, 6 to 5. Rochester defeats Baltimore, 6 to 5. Gen. Wu wins victory in big battle in China. Britain will not abandon Soudan to Egypt. Truce decided on by Dail Eireann between factions. Many U. S. golfers will play in Canada this season. Unemployed in Winnipeg visit Government House. Quebec elections will be held in the month of June. North Bay "Crosses" is sentenced to serve term in jail. Ambushes and bank robberies by Irish irregulars continue. France and Belgium form alliance aimed against Lloyd George. Two hundred Montreal longshoremen arraigned in police court. Seven members of one family at L'Orignal poisoned by parsnips. A three-year-old boy drank lye at Kirkland Lake and death results. A bill was before the House to give provinces the right to run buses. France will sign non-aggression pact if other nations do, but on conditions. Floods at Brandon appear to have reached peak and subsidence is expected. Indiana on Brantford reserve attacked policeman, and one family was arrested. Three small school boys disappear from Toronto and are located in Hamilton. Premier Greenfield addresses meeting of Victoria College Alumni at Toronto.
