**EXPLORING NEW** 

Advance Party Are Gathering Data Regarding Assets of This Unexplored Region.

The provincial government of Queee has organized on expedition into the Ungava territory, or as it should now be known, New Quebec, the first object of which will be the establishment of a series of posts or stations from which later on the great task of exploring the region and gathering information regarding its topography, rivers and streams, resources of timber and minerals wil be carried on. An innovation in Canadian exploratory work will be the introduction of wireless telephony, a system of communication which, from the outset, will eliminate many of the inconveniences and hardships of the pioneer work. The advance party went out during the summer and established a base of operations at Hamilton Inlet on the coast of Labrador.

It is just ten years since the boundaries of Quebec Province were extended to take in the territory of Ungava, which lay immediately north of east coast, which, under the name of Labrador, fell to the jurisdiction of ing showing the finished appearance veys.
