Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500.00) by issuing and selling of debentures to provide for the cost of a plant to distribute electric power to be supplied by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

WHEREAS it is necessary to raise by way of a loan on the credit of the Village of Jarvis the sum of Ten thousand Five hundred dollars (\$10,500.00) to provide for the cost of works, plant, machinery and appliances necessary for the distribution of Electric power in the said Village to be supplied by. the Hydro Electric Power Commission

AND WHEREAS the sum of Ten thousand Five hundred dollars (\$10,-500.00) is the debt intended to be

created by this by-law.
AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable in yearly sums during the period of Twenty years, being the currency of said debentures, the said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable each year for principal and interest in respect of the said debt shall be as nearly as possible equal the amount payable in each of the other nineteen years of the said
