VILLAGE OF JARVIS

BY-LAW No. 60

TO take the votes of the ratepayers of the Village of Jarvis entitled to vote on Money by-law on a question to be submitted as to whether the said ratepayers are in favor of a supply of Electric Power in the Village of Jarvis from the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis deem it advisable to submit, to the ratepayers of the said Village of Jarvis entitled to vote on Money by-laws, a question as to whether the said ratepayers are in favor of a supply of Electric Power from the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis enacts as follows: That the question to be submitted to the ratepayers of the Municipality of the Village of Jarvis, entitled to vote on money by-laws, is: Are you in favor of obtaining from the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario a supply of Electric power?

That the vote of the ratepayers shall be taken on the question at the following time and place, to-wit: At a meeting of the ratepayers held by the Deputy Returning Officer and Poll Clerk hereinafter named at that is to say: On Friday the 31st day of August A.D., 1923, at 10 o'clock A.M. until 5 o'clock P.M. at the Council Chamber.

A true copy of this by-law shall be published in the following newspaper on the days hereinafter mentioned that is to say: THE JARVIS RECORD, August 9th, 16th, 23rd, and 30th, 1923.

And a copy of this by-law shall be posted at the following places in the Village of Jarvis:

Clerk's Office; Council Chamber and the Reeve's Office.

THAT on the 27th day of August, 1923, at the Council Chamber at 10 o'clock in the afternoon the Reeve will in writing signed by him appoint two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of the Village of Jarvis, and one person to attend at the Polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the said question in the affirmative and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the said question in the negative respectively.

THAT the Clerk of the said Municipality shall attend at the Council Chamber at the hour of one o'clock in the afternoon on the 1st day of September A.D., 1923, to sum up the number of votes given in the affirmative and the negative respectively.

VILLAGE OF JARVIS

BY-LAW No. 61

To authorize the borrowing of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500.00) by issuing and selling of debentures to provide for the cost of a plant to distribute electric power to be supplied by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

WHEREAS it is necessary to raise by way of a loan on the credit of the Village of Jarvis the sum of Ten thousand Five hundred dollars (\$10,500.00) to provide for the cost of works, plant, machinery and appliances necessary for the distribution of Electric power in the said Village to be supplied by the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

AND WHEREAS the sum of Ten thousand Five hundred dollars (\$10,500.00) is the debt intended to be created by this by-law, and WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time and to make the principal of the said debt repayable in yearly sums during the period of Twenty years, being the currency of said debentures, the said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable each year for principal and interest in respect of the said debt shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount payable in each of the other nineteen years of the said period.

AND WHEREAS the total amount required to be raised annually by special rate for paying the said debt and interest, as herein provided, is Eight hundred and sixty three dollars and sixty three cents (\$863.63).

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Village of Jarvis according to the last revised assessment roll agreed to, is One hundred and Eighty five thousand three hundred and twenty four dollars and seventy three cents (\$185,374.73).

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Jarvis enacts as follows:
1. THAT for the purposes aforesaid it shall be lawful for the Reeve and Treasurer of the said Village to borrow the sum of Ten thousand Five hundred dollars and to issue debentures of the said Corporation to the amount of Ten thousand Five hundred dollars, each of which debentures shall be dated on the day of the issue thereof and shall be payable within twenty years thereafter at the office of the Treasurer of the said Corporation.
2. THE said debentures shall be

payable in Twenty annual installments during the twenty years next after the issue thereof, and the respective amounts of principal and interest payable during each of the said years shall be as follows:

3. EACH of the said debentures shall be signed by the Reeve of the said Village of Jarvis, or by some other person authorized by-law to sign the same and by the Treasurer hereof and the Clerk shall seal the same with the common seal of the said Corporation.

4. THE interest shall be at the rate of Five and one-half per cent. per annum and instead of being represented by coupons attached to the debentures the sum payable for interest in the respective years shall be included at the debentures maturing, so that in each year the sum of Eight hundred and seventy eight dollars and sixty three cents shall be paid for principal and interest.

5. DURING the currency of the said debentures there shall be raised annually by special rate on all the rateable property in the said Village of Jarvis the sum of Eight hundred and seventy eight dollars and sixty three cents for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the said years for principal and interest in respect of the said debt.

6. THIS by-law shall take effect and come into operation from and after the final passing thereof.

7. THE votes of the ratepayers of the said Village of Jarvis shall be taken on this question on Friday the 31st day of August 1923, commencing at the hour of 9 o'clock A.M. and continuing until 5 o'clock P.M. at the following place and by the Deputy Returning Officer and Poll Clerk hereinafter mentioned that is to say: At the Council Chamber by Andrew Rogers, Deputy Returning Officer and Helen Steel, Poll Clerk.

8. ON the 27th day of August, 1923, at the Council Chamber in the said Village of Jarvis at 12 o'clock noon, writing signed by him, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of this Corporation and one person to attend at the polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this by-law and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this by-law.

9. THE First day of September, A.D. 1923 at the Council Chamber in the said Village of Jarvis at 12 o'clock noon is hereby appointed the time for the summing up by the Clerk of this Corporation of the number of votes given for and against the said by-law.
