VOICES ARE PRESERVED

One of the uses to which the phonograph is frequently adapted is the preservation of the voices and the perpetuation of the messages of the world's great ones. Gladstone's voice has been preserved on a record taken in 1890. In this same year a number of other people had their voices taken, among the m'Florence Nightingale, P. T. Barnum, Mrs. Browning and Henry M. Stanley, the explorer of Africa. Gladstone's record is part of a speech that was to be conveyed as a message to a meeting in New York. Florence Nightingale's voice is very clear, and the message is touching:

"God bless my old comrades at Balaclava and bring them safe to shore." Equally characteristic is P. T. Barnum: "I congratulate the world through the medium of that wonderful invention, the phonograph, that my voice, like my show, will reach future generations and be heard centuries after I have joined the great and, as I believe, happy majority."

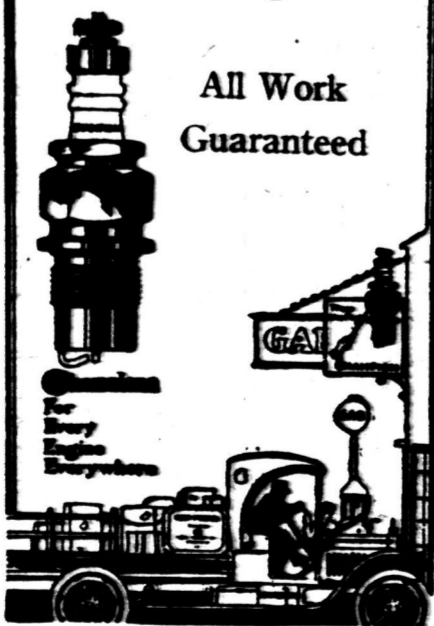

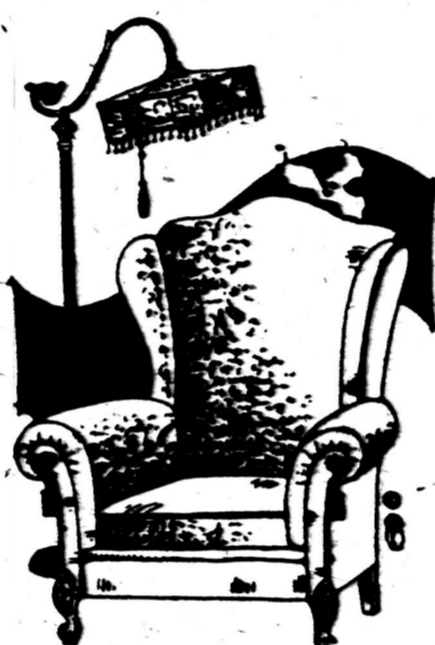
