FIRE SWEEP ASYLUM

Death Toll of 25 in New York Institution

It was the homicidal ward that the blaze destroyed and contained a great number of dangerous maniacs, so that work of rescue proved perilous for keepers.

NEW YORK, Feb. 19. — Fire on Sunday swept a unit of the Manhattan State Asylum for the insane on Ward's Island, killing 25 patients and nurses, and leaving nearly 1,800 insane out of their cells into the stinging cold.

Among the five bodies identified were those of three war veterans who had been suffering from shell shock.

The building in which the fire occurred is an ancient brick and wood structure, shaped like the letter E. It is three stories high and has accommodations for a maximum of 2,200 patients.

The fire was discovered at 5 o'clock by Michael Campbell, an attendant in Ward 43, where all the inmates occurred.

As fast as the maniacs—declared by Superintendent Heyman to have been the most dangerous on the island—could be marshalled from their rooms, they were marched in orderly procession to the fireproof dining hall, far from the scene of the fire.

Seventy of the 92 inmates of Ward 43 had been led or carried to safety from a huge water tank in the blazing attic chamber through the ceiling, completely blocking the corridor that led to safety, and filling the hall with flames and smoke.
