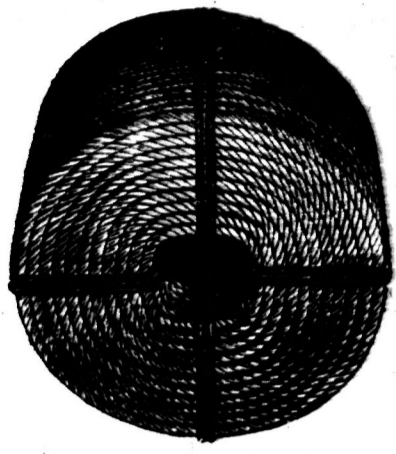

vote and not one of the three kept their promise. Mr. Howard Ferguson was the man who stood behind Sir William Hearst in his temperance In the first year of the Drury administration the government was new and inexperienced and the Conservatives assisted it all that was possible. After that first session they felt it was their duty to criticize the government so it is the duty of any opposition.

The country today is flooded with bootleggers and law breakers. The Drury government in its supreme hypocrisy says this is a bone dry Ontario but the government is making a million and a half of dollars out of it.  
Miss Boulton explained the Shevlin-Clark deal, saying the timber limit was without tender, because it was impossible to obtain tenders with a brush burning clause and it was necessary to find a way to save the country that awful fire hazard but it was

only 23 square miles while the Drury government gave away 5,500 square miles to an American millionaire. It asked for tenders but gave only three or four weeks and one expert said it would take three years to cruise the limit. The only other tenders were from men employed by Backus.
