DEEPLY ROOTED IN ENG. LISH AND SCOTTISH HSTORY.

Lady Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon Reared in Kingly Castle Often Visited by Monarchs.

Lady Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon, who upon her marriage to the Duke of York will acquire royal rark under English law, need not be at all abashed when she is adopted into the regal family circle at Buckingham Palace. For the Bowes-Lyon family have a lineage that is deeply rooted in Scottish and English history and for centuries they have been on terms of intimacy with reigning monarchs.

Lady Elizabeth will not therefore walk with hesitant step when the great gates of Buckingham Palace swing wide in welcome to her as a daughter of the royal household. Her home. Glamis Castle, which has been the chief seat of the Earls of Strathmore for many centuries, is a truly kingly palace, hoary with age, dreamy withal, sporting it secret chambers with legend, steeped in history as well as a ghost or two. Here life for the Bowes-Lyon family was a pageant of beauty as long ago as the eleventh century. It is from this background that one of the daughters of the Bowes-Lyon clan emerges in the twentieth century to take her place on terms of equality with Britain's royal family.

The earliest reference to the family, whose name has been associated for centuries with Glamis Castle, is to the effect that one of the noble French Leonnes came over to England with William the Conqueror. His son, Roger, accompanied King Edgar, son of Malcolm Canmore, to Scotland about 1091 and became the founder of the family fortunes there. From him are descended the Thanes of Glamis and the present Earls of Strathmore.

Source of Many Legends. The thanage of Glamis possesses a literary interest from its imaginary connection with MacBeth. It's rather a pity to spoil a good story but Shakespeare's account of the murder of Duncan by the Thane of Glamis is not strictly historical. 
