

Canada from Coast to Coast

St. John's, Nfld.—The iron mines at Wabana which were closed early this year as the result of the cancellation of German contracts for ore after the French occupation of the Ruhr, are again in operation. An agreement has been reached between the Newfoundland Government and the British Empire Steel Corporation, whereby the latter in consideration of the waiving of the export duty of 25 cents per ton imposed on this ore for the current year, agrees to provide employment for 1,400 men during February and March, for 1,500 in April and May, and to resume normal working of the mines after June.

St. John, N.B.—The port record for fast loading was broken recently by the steamer Skikistad, putting 360,000 bushels aboard in 25½ hours, setting a new record. She arrived at 5 o'clock in the evening of Sunday, February 18, and sailed on Saturday afternoon, fitting out completely and loading in the meantime.

Three Rivers, Que.—The output of the International Paper Co.'s mill at Three Rivers is now running about 245 tons a day, an addition of nearly 80,000 tons to the Canadian total since the middle of last year. The company is planning to install the second grinder unit to increase the production of groundwood pulp to enable the capacity production to be attained, and a third digester for the sulphite pulp, which is expected about 25 per cent. of the pulp produced.

Port Wabana, Ont.—A total of 3,700 licensed country elevators in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, have a total storage capacity of more than 100,000,000 bushels, according to a statement made before the Royal Commission investigating lake freight rates. At Port Wabana and Port Arthur 31 private and public elevators will accommodate 56,810,000 bushels. Ontario, Quebec, and the Maritime Provinces have elevators with grain storage capacity amounting to 33,180,000 bushels.

Winnipeg, Man.—The remarkable growth of boys' and girls' pig clubs in Manitoba is indicated in a report which has just been issued by the provincial government. Two years ago there were only four boys' and girls' pig clubs in the province with a very small number of pigs in each club. At the present time there are over 27 pig clubs, with a total of 1,334 pigs.

Calgary, Alta.—Alberta's total coal production last year was 5,978,432 tons, according to a statement issued by the Provincial Department of Mines. Of this quantity 1,448,942 tons were sold in Alberta, 1,999,739 in other Canadian provinces, and 105,514 in the United States. The total production was 39,327 tons in excess of that of 1921.

Vancouver, B.C.—Valued at \$11,500,000, the British Columbia salmon pack aggregated 1,299,326 cases, according to figures compiled by the Provincial Department of Fisheries. 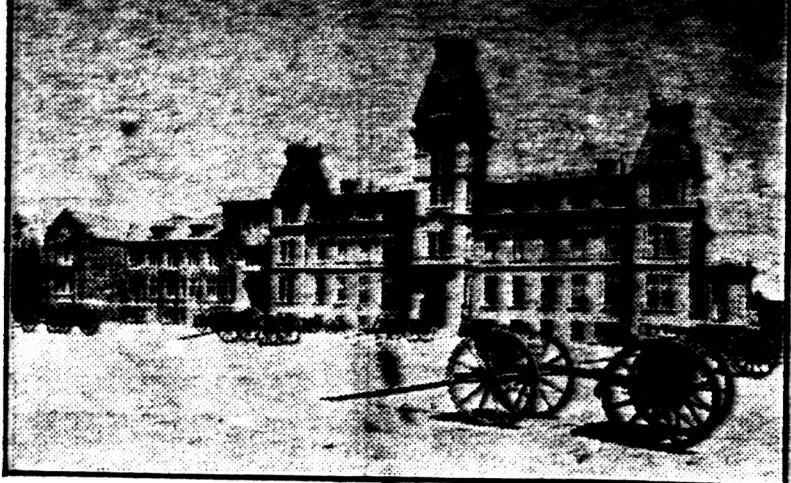

THE SUIT CASE TEACHER

There are some teachers in the rural schools of Ontario, who arrive at their schools, by train or auto, at exactly ten minutes to nine on Monday morning, with all their belongings packed in a suitcase, and shake the dust of the community off their feet as soon after four o'clock on Friday evening as it is possible for them to get away. Their real interests are in the communities where they spend their week ends. With such a residence in the School Section they are not likely to take a very keen interest in the welfare of the children committed to them for instruction and training. Their duties are likely to be performed in a most perfunctory manner and the school work has little or no relation to the daily life and experience of the pupils. In the story of the "Brown Mouse", we are told that the teacher, Jim Irwin, had the school in operation in the lives of the people a month before the actual opening of the school. He visited all the homes, learned much about the community and then made the school a real factor in the life of the people. But how can a teacher who does not live among the people and seldom meets the parents and children together and perhaps never sees the trustees, be of service to the School Section?

Trustees should apply other than the merely academic tests to applicants who are ready to assume the responsibilities of directing the mental and moral development of the young life of the community.

1. Ask him some questions to ascertain what he knows about current events. I had the pleasure of visiting the School for the Blind in Brantford recently and heard the principal relate how he spends the first lesson period of the day reviewing the current events of the world as reported in the newspapers. These children will have some conception of the duties and privileges of citizenship. The children of our public schools are not blind physically but they are, nevertheless, ignorant of what is going on in the world and a live teacher has a magnificent opportunity to initiate them into the secrets and mysteries of their relation to the complex world about them. Try to find out whether the applicant is qualified to direct the young people to a consideration of community, provincial, national and world movements. The school is financed by all the citizens and should be the agency in democracy for the training of future citizens. The teacher can only do this as he identifies himself with the community.

2. Don't measure his success by his ability to get pupils successfully through examinations. That is not education. Cramping facts into children's minds for examination purposes only regards real educational development. Some of the pupils who have failed at examinations have turned out to be the brightest. Let him train the children in habits of study and create in them a desire for knowledge. The skill acquired prior to the age of fourteen constitutes what might be termed as the knife and fork of education and not the meal. Given these tools of education the boys and girls should have their appetites whetted for reading and for study and have their interests awakened so they will have some ambition to acquire knowledge.

3. Does he join with the young people in their social and recreational life or hold himself aloof? Vigorous young people require recreational opportunities and facilities. The school trustees have been a magnificent opportunity to render service to the young people of the community by selecting a teacher who will take an interest in this phase of community life and direct it along wholesome lines.

The suit-case teacher does not earn

a thousand dollars a year, nor the half of it. The real teacher is worth more than a thousand dollars a year to the community, only he is too rare. We need more of them. Perhaps we will help to find them. Let school boards insist on having them and give worthwhile remuneration to retain their services. Equality of educational opportunity is an empty phrase so long as some children are compelled to sit at the feet of incompetent, inexperienced teachers. In the last analysis it is the teacher who makes the school. Let us have teachers who love their work and take a real interest in the affairs of the community.

One factor in securing teachers for rural schools who will identify themselves with rural life is the teacher's salary. The Government of Saskatchewan makes a grant of \$200 to those sections building a house for the teacher. The residences which have been erected have cost from \$400 to \$1,800 and in some districts it is found that such a building is an absolute necessity. The Alberta Government passed legislation in 1919 making provision for a grant in aid of school residences of a better type. Under this Act the Department pays one-third of the cost of the site for the residence, the building and the furniture for the same, on condition that the residence shall at least contain three, four or five rooms and in a few cases the cost has run up to \$3,000 or \$3,500, but in the majority of cases the buildings erected cost from \$1,000 to \$2,000.

The Natural Resources Intelligence Service of the Department of the Interior at Ottawa says:
