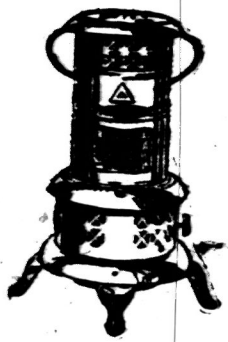

While working on the construction of the east end pier of the new Cayuga bridge on Saturday afternoon, about 1.30 o'clock, Thomas Long was hit on the head when the hoist which was lifting a large stone bumped against the top of the old pier, knocking off a stone, which hit Mr. Long, who was standing under it. Mr. Long was taken at once to the office of Dr. Bromley, who dressed his wounds. He was able to go home to East Seneca on Saturday night.

John Eubank, who recently bought the flour and feed store of Mr. R. J. Hinds has bought the residence of S. H. Sternamen, on the south side of the new provincial highway and recently vacated by Mr. Mendezables, of the provincial highway department.

At the next meeting of the Cayuga board of trade steps will be taken to advertise for a new veterinary, there being a splendid opening in this section.

M. Mendezables, who has been working on the engineering staff on the new provincial highway between Niagara Falls and Simcoe, moved his family to Toronto on Saturday, where he will spend the winter.

Eugene Barrey, an employee of D. P. Foster's department store, injured his shoulder on Saturday while delivering goods.

S. L. Kelso, agent at Edward station who is away on his honeymoon this week, will, when he returns, live in the house now occupied by Chas. Duncan, who is moving into the home now occupied by his mother. The latter is going to Toronto shortly to live.

Dutch McDonald has bought the bus line business owned by Earle Gill, operating between Dunnville and Caledonia.

The work of moving the Cayuga bridge is progressing fine, and the second large span was moved on Saturday afternoon in 55 minutes. The contractor expects to have the whole structure moved in a few days. The passenger foot bridge, with sides on it, is used by a large number of people who leave their cars on the west side of the river.

### MUCH SHOOTING IN NORFOLK

Gun-play was rife in Norfolk during the week-end. Saturday forenoon armed men in an automobile were driven off after they had killed one bird of a flock of turkeys.

Late Saturday night, while driving one of the Simcoe bakery bread trucks out in Windham, Roy Grilling was trailed, and the truck shot at, apparently twice. One bullet went through the cab of the truck and whizzed past the driver's face.

Sunday night about 8.15 there was promiscuous shooting from racing automobiles passing through Norfolk street. James Miller, returning to town, was alarmed by a call to halt and a report from a revolver.

### AGES OF COMMON THINGS

At the inquest in England on two men drowned by the sinking of a barge in the Thames, a question was asked as to the age of the barge, and it was stated that the craft was about fifty years old. "Then it was getting very old," said the coroner. "Oh, no," was the reply. "A barge well cared for will last a hundred years. There is at least one lighter on the river which is 120 years old." No modern steel vessel would last half so long. A steel ship is old at thirty. Of articles in every-day use some will last an amazingly long time, if properly cared for. There are plenty of grandfather clocks, for instance, which are still going after two centuries of steady timekeeping. There is a chaplain who possesses a watch which an ancestor of his wore in 1780, and which still keeps excellent time. Again there is in daily use a hair-brush which once belonged to Edward Leveson-Gower, who died in 1854. The present age of the brush is about one hundred and thirty years and it is still as good as ever.
