Bay Company and the North West Company were contr wealth of northern Canada, the little post of Fond du Lac on Lake Athabasca, seven hundred miles north of the boundary lines. It was the famous explorer, Samuel Hearne, who was the first white man on Lake Athabasca, on which this post is situated. He was returning from his discovery of the Coppermine River, and his expedition to the shores of the Artic ocean, seeking the Northwest Passage, when Hearne was led by Indians to Lake Athabasca. He claimed the territory between it and the Artic for the Hudson's Bay Company. The Fond du Lac post today still carries on the tradition the great trading company in the vast fur lands of the north.



I like to think that on the day of my ordination his hand was laid on head, and sometimes, when the world seems cold and sad and lon-ly, I like to repeat his hymn. It seems as if a door opens in Heaven; the old forms take shape again; the old face smiles again.

"Hark, the sound of holy voices Chanting at the crystal sea." Yes, that hymn in the quiet communing with one's own heart; and in the congregation there is still no better hymn than his—full, rich, and generous as a vintage wine—the almsgiving hymn, the hymn of charity, the hymn of harvest-

"O Lord of heaven and earth and

To Thee all praise and glory be; How shall we show our love to Thee
Who givest all?"
