Puts Party Second

It is easy for the member of any government to follow the leader, of his party blindly.

His way is easy for he has to do no thinking for himself and criticism, if directed to him, is not direct but aimed and shared by the whole party. But it takes a man of a little better stuff to be independent of party, to stand by his own convictions of what is right and by his own conscience. And in the end people will think more of him although it might not be the better way to prepare for the next election so far as votes are concerned, especially for the votes cast by the men who put party first and everything else second.

Dr. R. N. Berry, member of the legislature from Haldimand, is the kind of a man who puts party second and his own convictions first and in addition to that he has the courage to go through with it even though those members of his own party, who are partisans first, last and all the time are liable to make some unkind remarks, even though his seat may not be as comfortable as it might be because he has had the courage to play politics as politicians believe the game should not be played.

Dr. Berry demonstrated the stuff he was made of this week when he opposed the government on a government measure, the new Gas Act. Mr. Berry was elected as a Conservative and as such is supposed to support the government on all questions—unless he wants to be more than a blind follower of the procession and let the other fellow do his thinking. But in his maiden speech in the legislature he opposed the government and followed that up by voting against it.

Some men are wanted in the provincial legislature and the Dominion parliament. More men are wanted to stand for right and not for themselves or for party. Canada and Ontario must be governed for Canada's and Ontario's sake and not for party's sake if she is to rise to the place among nations where she belongs.

Politicians look on the man who bolts almost as a traitor but 'tis better to be a traitor to his party or to his own interests than a traitor to his country. The choice may be difficult and so often it is made the wrong way. Canada and Ontario would be a whole lot better if there were more traitors to party.

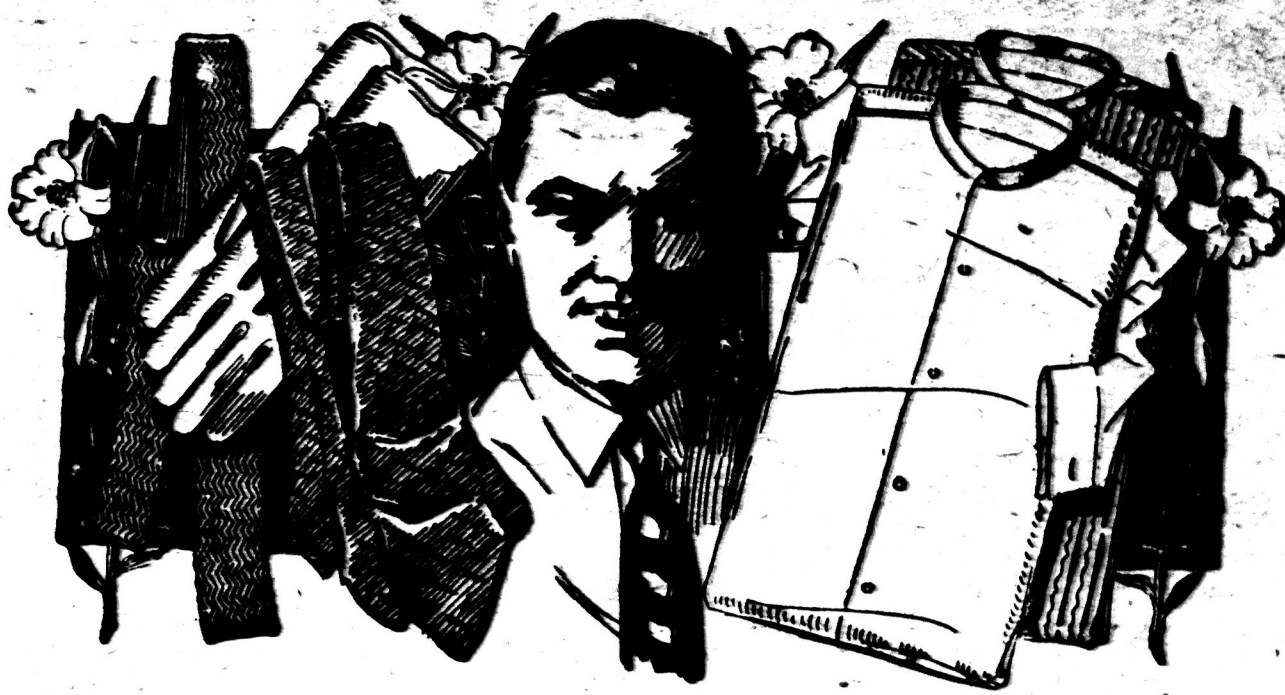
