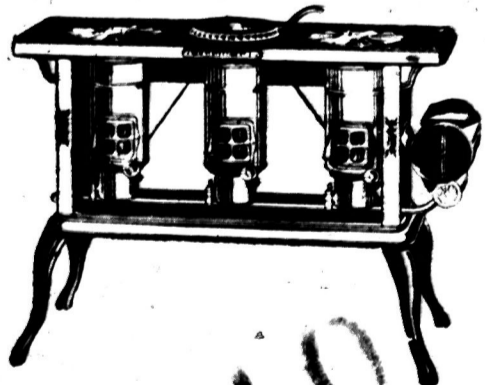

FAILED TO KILL ANYBODY!
The writer of this admits he is an old grouch, a crank, a nut and that he harps much on one string. Having confessed to that let us harp a little more:

It is not necessary to prove the contention that the cigarette smoker has no moral perception or regard for public safety.

Last week at a baseball game we ceased rooting long enough to protest against the action of a pill-shooter deliberately dropping a burning butt through the tinder-dry planks to the roof of a small building below. We won the point without a personal encounter. The lives and safety of five thousand persons was endangered by the act of the brainless idiot and he was told so while an attendant was extinguishing the blaze.

Recently a pill-shooter at Dallas, Texas got in his deadly work. He burned the baseball park quite successfully but his disappointment must have been great. The 10,000 persons in attendance were nearly all out of the park when his little blaze broke out into irresistible flames. Only a few were hurt. The loss was only \$60,000. It might have been twice that but for prompt and effective work of the fire department.

Preventable fires cost countless lives and immeasurable treasure each year. We are content to have efficient departments to work AFTER the destroyer has set the fires.

The man who goes away and leaves a campfire burning so that it spreads and causes a forest fire is a criminal in the eyes of the law. A pill-shooter who throws a cigarette stub where it causes or may cause the loss of human life is criminally insane and should be restrained in surroundings where he is not a public menace.
