The attention of the spectators is called to the fact that opposite sides of each die always totals seven. This is a fact with every properly made die. The two dice are placed on the tip of the forefinger and the spectators are asked to observe which numbers are on top. The numbers being noted, the thumb of the same hand is placed on them. The spectators are asked to tell which numbers will be undermost. As they have learned that the spots on opposite sides of wile always total seven they are able to answer the question. When the hand is turned over and the forefinger lifted it is seen that two other spots are presented to view. The forefinger again covers the dice and the hand is turned over. The thumb is lifted and the spots

originally seen are exposed. The secret is very simple but the trick is perplexing. When the hand is turned over, the thumb is drawn back a trifle. causing each die to make a quarter of a revolution. With a little practice this can be done without fear of detection. The same movement, reversed, restores the dice to their original positions.


