**A Christmas Appeal**

An appeal is being made to the Sunday Schools in aid of the "Save the Children Fund," to give relief to the starving refugee children of Greece and for the little ones driven from their homes in Turkey.

Out of the million and a quarter of these refugees, half a million—mostly women and children and helpless old folks—are living under conditions of hunger, exposure and destitution unknown anywhere in the world today.

The Save the Children Fund is appealing, through an all-British appeal, to feed a few thousands of these innocent war victims with one ration a day—enough to sustain life.

Canada, along with the other members of the Empire, is helping to meet this terrible tragedy of starvation.

Here are the present conditions, as revealed in recent telegrams from Greece:

"Condition of Chalkis refugees critical. Starvation and sickness rampant. Children mere skeletons, all ragged and living in ruined barracks, warehouses and tents."

"Malaria very prevalent and still increasing. Many members of our own personnel laid up."

"Much sickness among refugees now arriving at Sorovich. Nights already cold, and great need of blankets for sick refugees in tents."

"Situation Salonica daily more serious. Eight thousand new arrivals present on beach at Mikra quarantine station."

"Of 170,000 refugees still to arrive, 120,000 will remain at Salonica in tents for the winter."

Commenting on the situation the London "Times" prints the following: "There is no need to rake up again all the indescribably miserable suffering of this mass of uprooted humanity. There have been times, not so very long ago, when whole families were living in damp and almost unventilated caves, where the rats, challenged in their rights of possession, averaged themselves by gnawing the ears of the children that huddled there with their parents. And even the situation of these poor wretches was little worse than that of others who had struggled out in-

to the waste countryside." Although the League of Nations Refugee Settlement Commission is doing its utmost to settle them into productive occupation with money advanced on, and to be raised by an international loan, these funds cannot be used for charitable relief, and therefore for many months private charity can now save the lives of many thousands of these wretched people.

**Lightless Vehicles a Menace on Highways at Night**

At last, it would seem the lightless vehicles are to be prohibited from using the public highways of this province at night and so, aside from the reckless or otherwise unfit, the greatest menace on the highways between dusk and dawn is to be eliminated. Hon. George S. Henry, who fathered the last bill to this end, has now the mandate of Ontario in support of this measure. For a decade and a half he has had the active support of the Ontario Motor League in this humanitarian endeavor. For during that time the Motor League has campaigned for the abolition of the all too prolific cause of highway fatalities and casualties. Editorials on this subject have appeared in many of the newspapers of the province and it is significant that without exception they strongly support the proposal that all vehicles be required by law to carry lights at night. Everyone who has traveled on a provincial highway at night knows that safety calls for the carrying lights on horse-drawn vehicles as well as motor vehicles. On a dark night it is often extremely difficult for the driver of a motor car to discern a vehicle ahead, going in the same direction if it carries no light; and the slower-going vehicle is in danger of being run down. Strangely enough, the reason why there is no law making it compulsory to carry lights on the horse-drawn vehicles that public opinion in the rural districts is strongly set against any such regulation. One would suppose that for the sake of their own safety the farmers would favor it. Objections would probably be removed by the adoption of a simple expedient. Let there be an amendment to the statute law, providing that in the case of a collision between a motor vehicle and a horse-drawn vehicle after dark, an action for damages will not lie if the horse-drawn vehicle carried
