PETER SMITH IN LIBRARY

Kingston, Dec. 15.—Peter Smith, former provincial treasurer, who is serving a term in the Portsmouth penitentiary in connection with bond deals, is now at work in the library of the institution, as assistant librarian, while Charles Matthews, Jr., his former deputy, is assisting T. D. Minnes, the prison accountant.

Smith spent some time in the prison hospital after coming to the pen, but was allowed out a week ago and was assigned to his work in the library, where he will help look after more than 10,000 books used by the inmates.

Matthews has been placed in the bookkeeping department under Mr. Minnes, his knowledge of accounting being recognized. Both have assumed their duties and apparently are resigned to their fate.

NOT TO BE SOLD BY BUSHEL

An inspector for the Root Vegetables Act paid a visit to Dunnville market on Tuesday last and gave a warning against the prevailing manner of selling potatoes from farmers' and dealers' trucks.

Briefly, the Dominion Act of 1922 requires potatoes and onions to be sorted in three grades as to size and quality.

Potatoes and onions, in bags, must have the grower's or vendor's full name on tag attached, if in crates or barrel, the name to be stamped thereon.

Potatoes, onions, artichokes, beets, carrots, parsnips and turnips are to be sold by weight, and standard pound weight the unit of weight to be used.
