 ning.

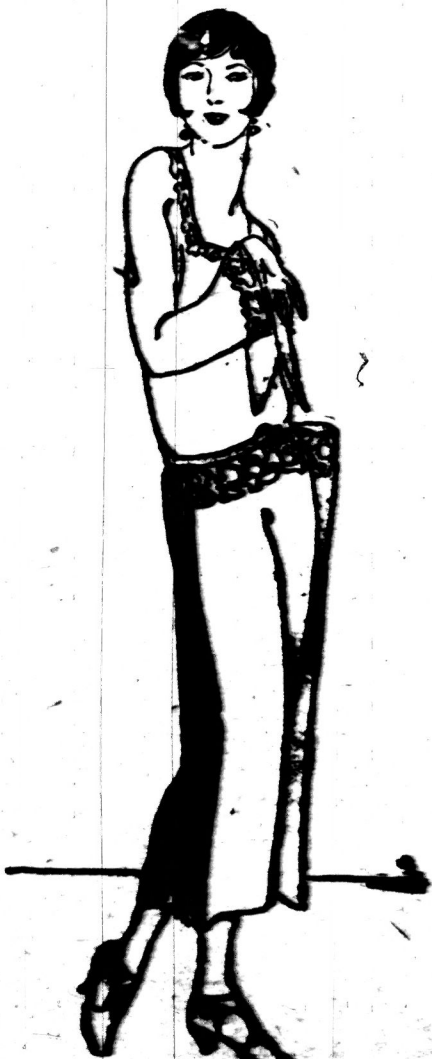
The W.M.S. met on Thursday last
