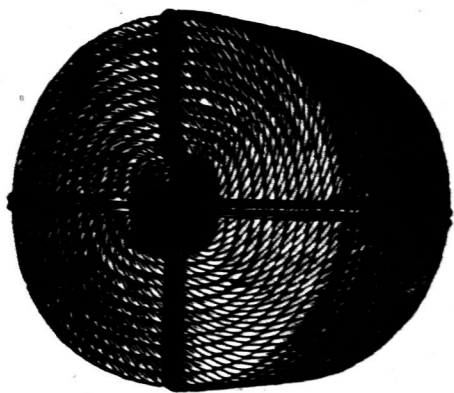

4. Contestants will
be notified in writing of
the date and place of
the judging.
5. Any person who
enters a contest in this
competition will not be
eligible to compete in
any other class.
6. Contestants must
be present at the place
of judging for a period
of at least one hour be-
fore the judging begins.
7. Prizes will be
awarded to the winners
of each class.
