**Nitrate of Soda Helps in Cold Springs**

In such a season as this, cold and wet, the greatest need of the plant is for nitrates, says the Department of Chemistry, Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph. The ground is so cold and wet that it takes a long time to warm up and as a result bacterial activity is at a low ebb. As a result nitrates are being formed in the soil and plants cannot make vegetative growth.

To correct this and enable the plant to get away to a good start, apply nitrate of soda one hundred pounds to one hundred and fifty pounds per acre at once. If bought in lots of several hundred pounds it can be obtained at a reasonable price and its benefit is almost certain. Do not, however, apply if heavy rain threatens, as it is soluble and will be lost by washing. Another benefit which will be derived is this. The nitrate of soda dissolves in the soil water and soaks down into the soil. The roots go after it and hence the result is a deeper rooted plant more able to withstand the period of drouth which so often follows a wet seed time.

**Last Year's Weather**

We have heard a lot about the season being backward, and that unless a change for the better comes very soon poor crops may be expected.

W. F. Moore, principal of the Dunlop High School, who keeps a daily



weather report, says that this month's weather has been no more unfavorable than last year, and submits the following report for last year as a proof:

May 8—Rain all day; quite cold.  
May 9—Heavy rain and snow flurries.  
May 10—Ground white with snow. At Owen Sound, Tara and Warton, fully a foot of snow.  
May 11—Cold; no growth.  
May 12—Cold, miserable day; raining steadily.  
May 13—Fine, quite cold; no leaves on the maples; no cherry or plum blossoms.  
May 14—Sharp frost during night.  
May 15—Heavy, cold rain.  
May 16—Heavy, cold rain.  
May 17—Heavy rain all day.  
May 18—Sharp frost during night.  
May 20—Heavy thunder storm with much rain.

Remainder of month—Fine but cool. So, concludes Mr. Moore, this May hasn't been bad by comparison, and it is not likely to affect adversely the crops since last year's more severe weather failed to hurt them.

**Speeches That Are Too Lengthy**

The after-dinner speaker who says he doesn't intend to make a speech, then inflicts his eloquence, or a lamentable lack of that quality, on a tiring audience for thirty minutes or more despite an hour that is late and a program that is behind in schedule, is still one of the trials of modern existence. **Presented President with Steel Spike**



George Munro, pioneer track layer of the Canadian Pacific Railway, received birthday congratulations on May 21 from Mr. E. W. Beatty, during the latter's recent visit in Vancouver. This meeting between one of the oldest employees and the executive head of the Canadian Pacific also marked the forty-ninth anniversary of the turning of the first sod on construction at Fort William in 1875, an event at which George Munro was present.

Another interesting co-incidence in connection with the meeting is the fact that the S. S. Quebec, which carried the handful of construction men including Mr. Munro, from Sarnia to Fort William, in May 1875, was owned and operated by the Beatty Steamship Line, of which Mr. Beatty's father, the late Mr. Henry Beatty, was president.

In 1881 when construction was begun on the last leg of the company's line between Yale, B. C. and the Coast, Mr. Munro was given charge of track laying at Emery, B. C. and when the last and famous "gold roller" was driven at Craigellachie by Lord Strathcona in 1885 he took possession of the steel spike which replaced the gold one and after treasuring it for the past 39 years as a keepsake presented it to Mr. Beatty.

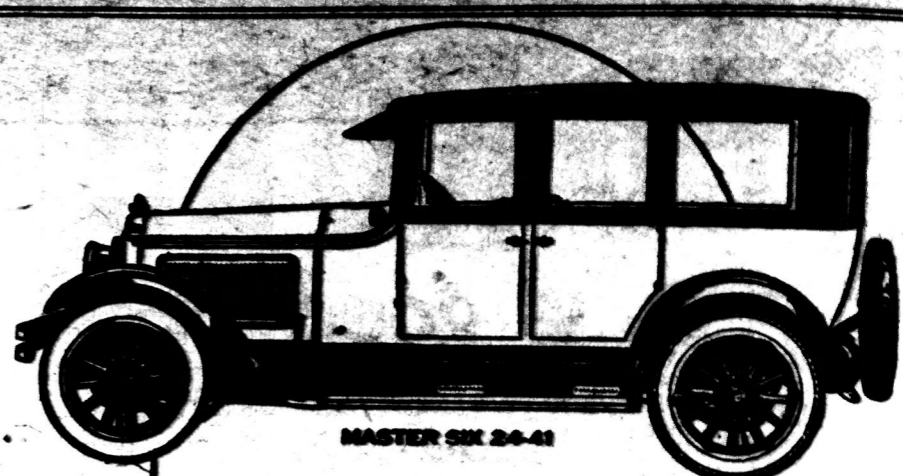
