Protect the Children

Every day in every newspaper there are stories of children run over and hurt by automobiles. In many cases the fault is with the motorist, but in many others the accidents are found to have been unavoidable. A man driving a car along a street can do nothing to avert an accident if a child suddenly rushes off the sidewalk and tries to cross the street in front of him. That is the cause of many accidents. Unfortunately, for many children, the streets are the only possible play-grounds, and it is difficult—but not impossible—to keep them on the sidewalk. Parents can do much to prevent accidents by insisting on their children keeping off the highway.

Return to Penny Postage

The plea for a return to penny postage within the Empire is redoubting in vigor, and it is believed the time is most opportune now that the Empire Exhibition is in progress at Wembley Park. It is recalled that it is now 26 years since the Imperial Postal Conference decided in favor of an Imperial Penny Postage, though that was not at once adopted by all the Dominions. On that occasion Canada, represented by Sir William Mulock, led the way in favor of the penny postage, heartily supported by the late Mr. Joseph Chamberlain. It is now urged that Canada should lead the way again, although in this respect it is forgotten that New Zealand has already reverted to penny postage since the war. However, the example of this country could hardly fail to have an effect all over Empire, as, for one thing, it would almost certainly induce Great Britain to fall into line.

The Farmers' Lot

In the whole sweep of industrial pursuits we know of no other industry that demands such a diversity of practical knowledge and wisdom as that of farming. The farmer must know a great deal about stock, grain,



weeds, grass, roots, soils, milk, butter, poultry, etc. He must have the practical knowledge of a veterinary, the trade of a butter maker, the knowledge of an orchardist, the facility of a marketman and the hands of a carpenter. But with all these accomplishments he is helpless against the attacks of unseasonable weather. At this moment in this community there is seed oats and corn rotting in the ground, and some fields idle that should be growing a crop. The weather was too wet and too cold. And yet these farmers are patient. They are ready to sow these fields with buckwheat when the time for this crop comes.

Good Old Corn Bread

Some farmers have their corn planted and some are preparing their fields for this crop. This is one of the best corn countries on the continent. Under good conditions it will produce one hundred bushels to the acre of corn, and under ideal conditions one hundred and twenty bushels. Yet we do not produce much corn cake. The mannies of the South can bake this cake to perfection, and men never tire of it, but our women have not caught the inspiration. Corn cake and good butter will make the world go round even if the backward weather should cut short the supply of white bread. But corn cake and white biscuits every second day will make the world content and banish a lot of jealousy. Let the men have something to eat and they will be sweet tempered and content.

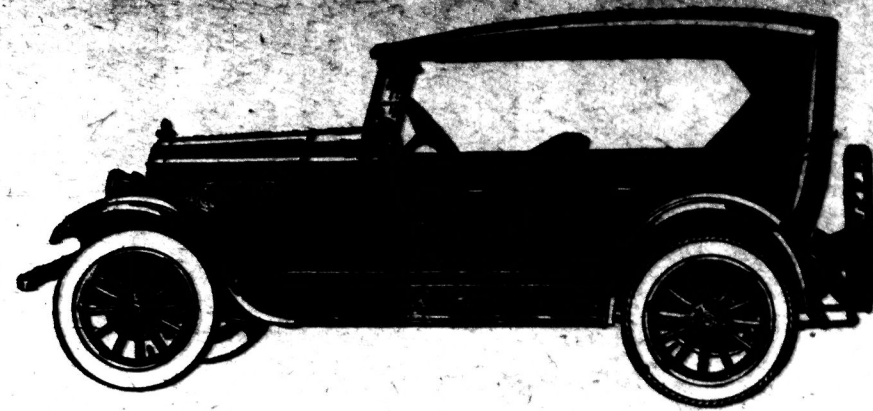

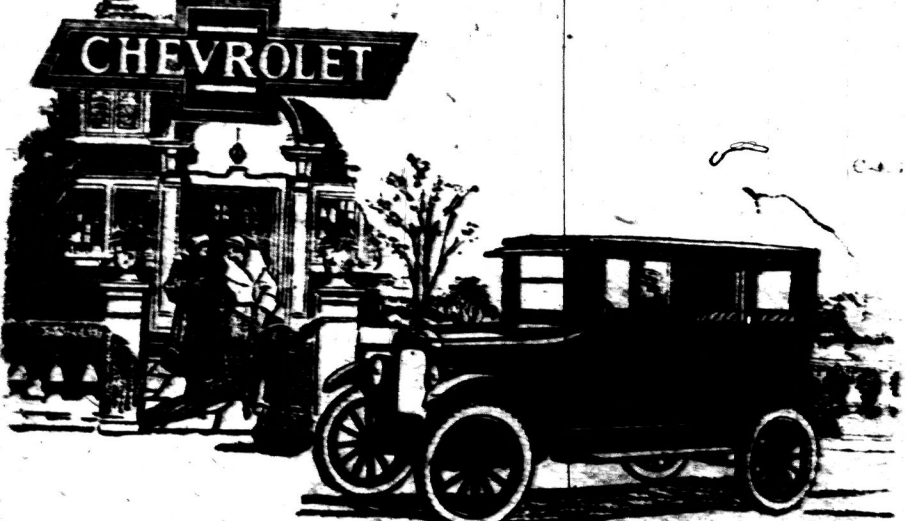
