Report of Special Committee Re Cost of Provincial Roads To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen: We your Special Committee appointed to check over the expenditures on Provincial Highways within the County during the years 1922 and 1923, beg leave to report as follows:

1. We received a letter dated May 2nd from Mr. Seitt, Chief Accountant in the Department of Public Highways, saying that their divisional Engineer has checked over carefully the information we asked for and find from the Norfolk County line to Nelles Corners distance 10 1/2 miles the cost for road surface was \$24,054.70 per mile.

2. The same letter also gives the following information from the Wentworth County Line to Corporation of Caledonia. A mistake had been made in the proportional of stone and freight for the Townships Seneca and Glanford, and that the statements submitted to the Counties of Wentworth and Haldimand require adjustment will represent approximately \$14,500 per mile, making a saving to County of \$1976.51.
