BEASTS ALL "WET TICKET" ADVOCATES

"Hunting Big Game in Africa" Reveals Peculiar Traits of the Jungle Beasts
While disclaiming a scientist's role, H. A. Snow, who made the "Hunting Big Game in Africa" picture for Universal whigerville, on March 11 and 12, is a naturalist of attainments and brought back a number of curious contributions to natural history. Mr. Snow studied the last small herd of white rhinoceros in existence, returning with one fine specimen for the Oakland (Cal.) Museum. He found that the mother rhino walks behind her young and guides its movements by prodding it with her elongated horn, which has the further use of ploughing up the ground for edible roots. In attack that four-foot horn is decidedly unpleasant, as was proved when a charging rhino stove in the motion picture camera and imperiled the lives of the hunter and his son. As the result of his observations on the "Hunting Big Game" expedition, Snow maintains that all animals drink. Creatures that had been thought to vote the dry ticket their lives long, are shown quaffing at unsuspected water holes. Only the great cats that drink the blood of their prey have little need of water.
