Favorite Hymns

"O GOD, OUR HELP IN AGES PAST"

O God, our help in ages past,
Our hope for years to come,
Our shelter from the stormy blast,
And our eternal home!

Beneath the shadow of Thy throne
Thy saints have dwelt secure;
Sufficient in Thine arms alone,
And our defence is sure.

Before the hills in order stood,
Or earth received her frame,
From everlasting Thou art God,
To endless years the same.

A thousand ages in Thy sight
Are like an evening gone;
Short as the watch that ends the night
Before the rising sun.

Time, like an ever-rolling stream,
Bears all its sons away;
They fly, forgotten, as a dream
Dies at the opening day.

O God, our help in ages past,
Our hope for years to come,
Be Thou our guard while troubles last,
And our eternal home!

It is still possible in spite of the electric light, and the Atlantic liners, and all the modern environment of Southampton Water, to imagine the picture which Isaac Watts saw in the year 1696, being then twenty-two years of age, when he looked out from the window of an ancient house with tears in his eyes, and the sight of the fair landscape across the water be-

came the inspiration of his verse—
"There everlasting spring abides,
And never withering flowers;
Death, like a narrow sea, divides
That heavenly land from ours."

Watts was not only a sweet singer, but the sole singer of the Independent Churches for many years; and the popularity of his hymns was so great that up to the middle of the nineteenth century a new edition was an annual event, and as late as 1864 there was a sale of 60,000 in a single year. There is no such sale in the present day, but still he survives, some of his best known hymns being found in every hymn book. Not a day passes without the repetition of his invitation—
"Come let us join our cheerful songs
With angels round the throne."
He is with the whole Church on New Year's Day—
"O God, our help in ages past,
Our hope for years to come."
He is equally present on Good Friday—
"When I survey the wondrous Cross—
And at every Missionary Meeting the spirit of Isaac Watts seems to lead the volume of song in
"Jesus shall reign where'er the sun."

In fact Isaac Watts fills the whole world of song in a way which no other hymn maker can ever hope to do. From the day of a man's birth to the day of his death Watts has a consoling verse.

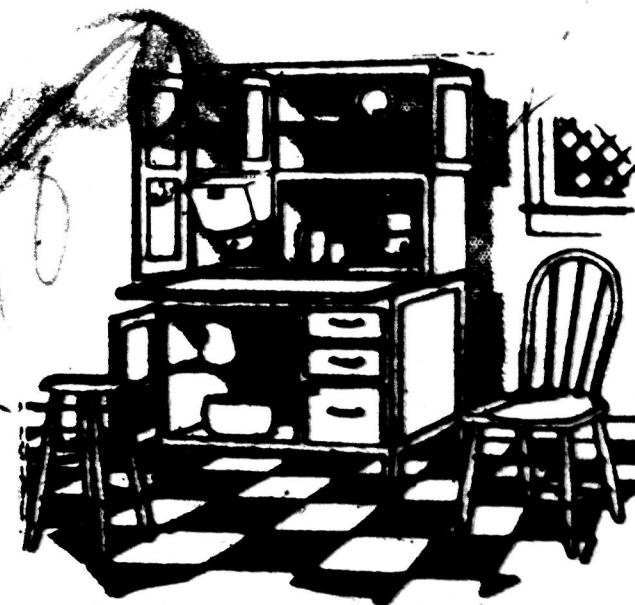
