Let us develop community loyalty to the full—the highest possible form of patriotism.

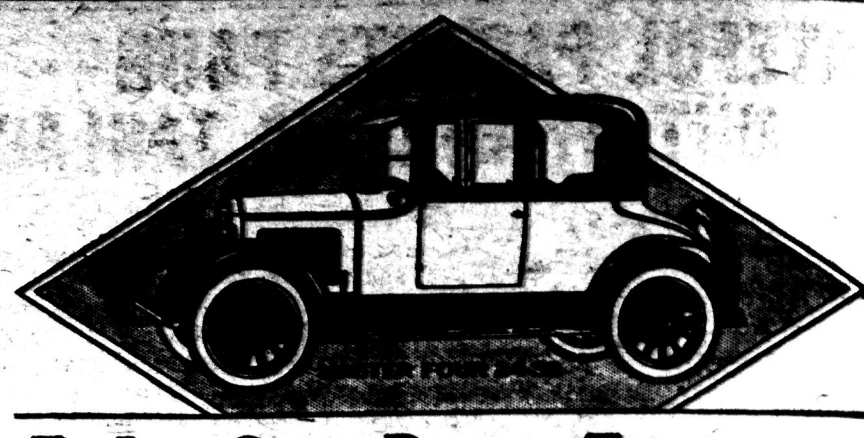
